








Library Serves Student Needs With Patience





Freshmen are required to take an introductory class to the social sciences that allows them to gain an overall sense of the academic area. Sciences Bolstered by New Acquisitions

The science department at NHS continued to update its curriculum this year. A much needed Apple II E computer with printer was added to the few already in use. The new computer reduced student waiting in the classroom and helped teachers process experimental data with greater efficiency. The biology students enjoyed even larger, brand-new texts this year that contained the latest in biological information and illustrations. Plans call for the arrival next year of new Earth Science textbooks that will provide updated information and increase the opportunity for students to participate in laboratory work. Students again participated in the Science Olympics. Fifteen to twenty students competed in activities ranging from rock identification, to bridge building, to chemical titration, to egg dropping, to laser shooting.





Creativity Finds Its Home at NHS

Physical Education Classes Foster Fitness







Substance Abuse Targeted by Program

1988 saw the addition of Student Assistance Program coordinator Charlie Stilec to the NHS staff. As a skilled substance abuse counselor, Mr. Stilec has had many new ideas for helping students and parents deal with substance abuse problems. Initially, he intends to set up a series of drug and alcohol awareness programs throughout the school system. Currently in the making is the After-Care Group for people who have completed treatment and are in need of reinforcement through counseling. Mr. Stilec has also formed a parent support group and a referral system for children in alcoholic homes. Through presentations to parent groups and a regular article on substance abuse in **The Northville Record**, Mr. Stilec hopes to bring community awareness to the ever-present dilemma of substance abuse, as well as giving direct advice to those who have a problem. In addition, general information on both alcohol and drug abuse is available to anyone who would like to become better informed. Mr. Stilec has a bachelor's degree in sociology from Alma College and a master's degree in guidance and counseling from Eastern Michigan University. Before coming to Northville, he was a therapist at Henry Ford Hospital's Maplegrove Youth Treatment Center in West Bloomfield.










NHS Band Marches On







Spirited Homecoming Week Provides A Wide Variety of Activities

















Spirit Week Survives February Snowstorm
















Couzens Guides NHS Speakers To Victory






Honor Society Benefits School And Community








Competitions Spur Students' Creative Work







Cross Country Team Strides To Fifth Place In Division






Men's Tennis Team Nets Seven Victories














Wrestlers Struggle With Losing Record







Softball Team Makes History in 1987






Gymnasts Vault to Victory








