













NHS IS "ART SMART"









NHS BANDS STRIKE UP A GREAT YEAR













YEARBOOK INCREASES MEMBERSHIP











"FAME" COMES TO NHS






WEST SIDE STORY





GYMNASTS VAULT TO SUCCESS







BEST SEASON IN FIVE YEARS




WRESTLERS WIN DIVISION



EQUESTRIAN TEAM SHOWS IMPROVEMENT





HARRIERS SHOW PROMISE




TRACKSTERS RUN HARD



THE BEST YET


The 1989 Varsity Girls' Tennis team produced one of the most successful seasons Northville's tennis program has had. They accumulated a total of seven titles.






WOMEN'S SOCCER ADVANCED TO REGIONALS










MEN'S SOCCER IMPROVES RECORD








BASEBALL SEASON ENDS STRONG






Above: The quarterback drops back for a pass.








FRESHMEN
