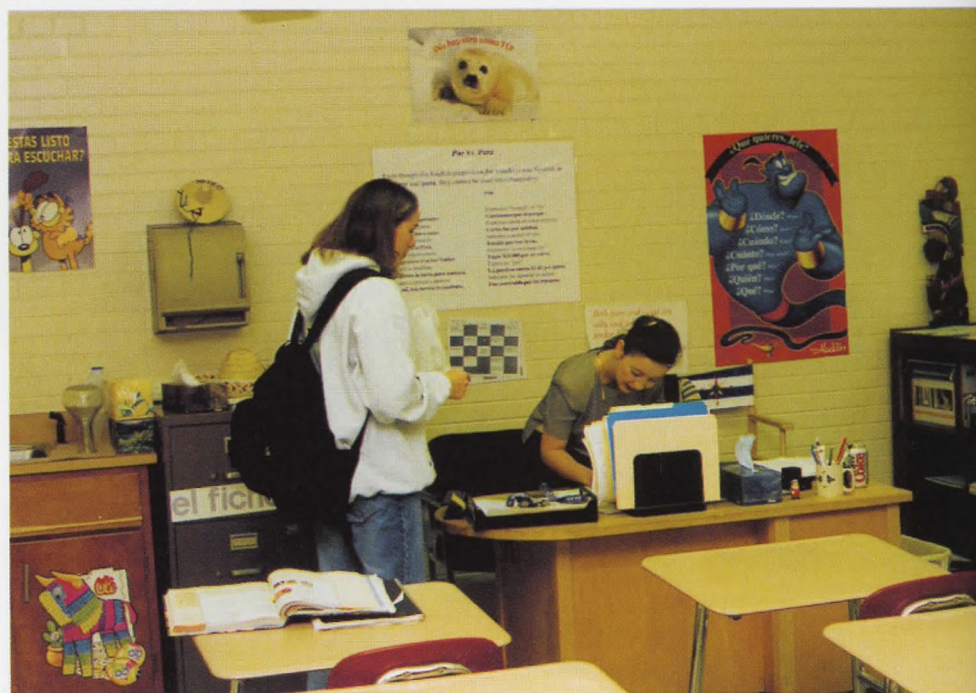

The moments before the first morning bell rings can be one of the most hectic times of the day. Halls filling with rushing students often add to the confusion.

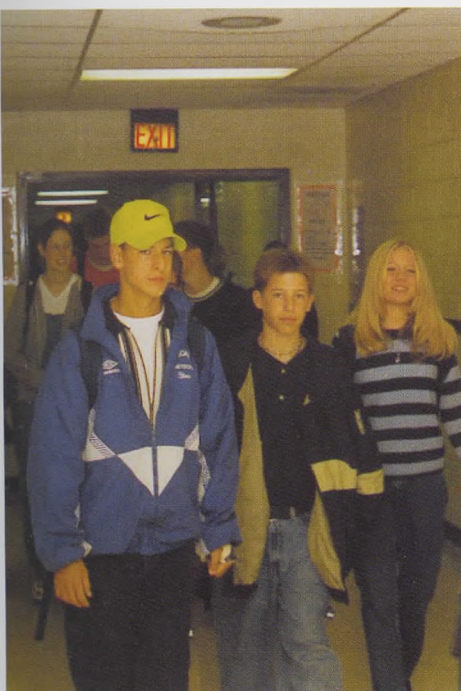

they can. Some stretch out on the floor while others simply lie down on a desk or across several chairs.

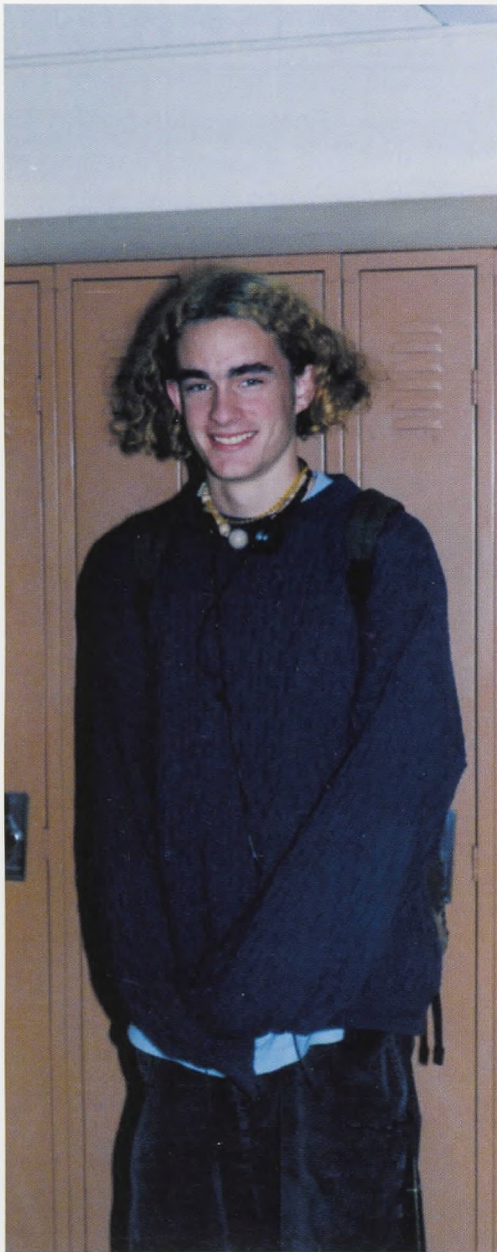

Once the bell tolls at 7:25 a.m., students rush to class in order to avoid additional tardies. As the halls empty out, another day begins at Northville High School.

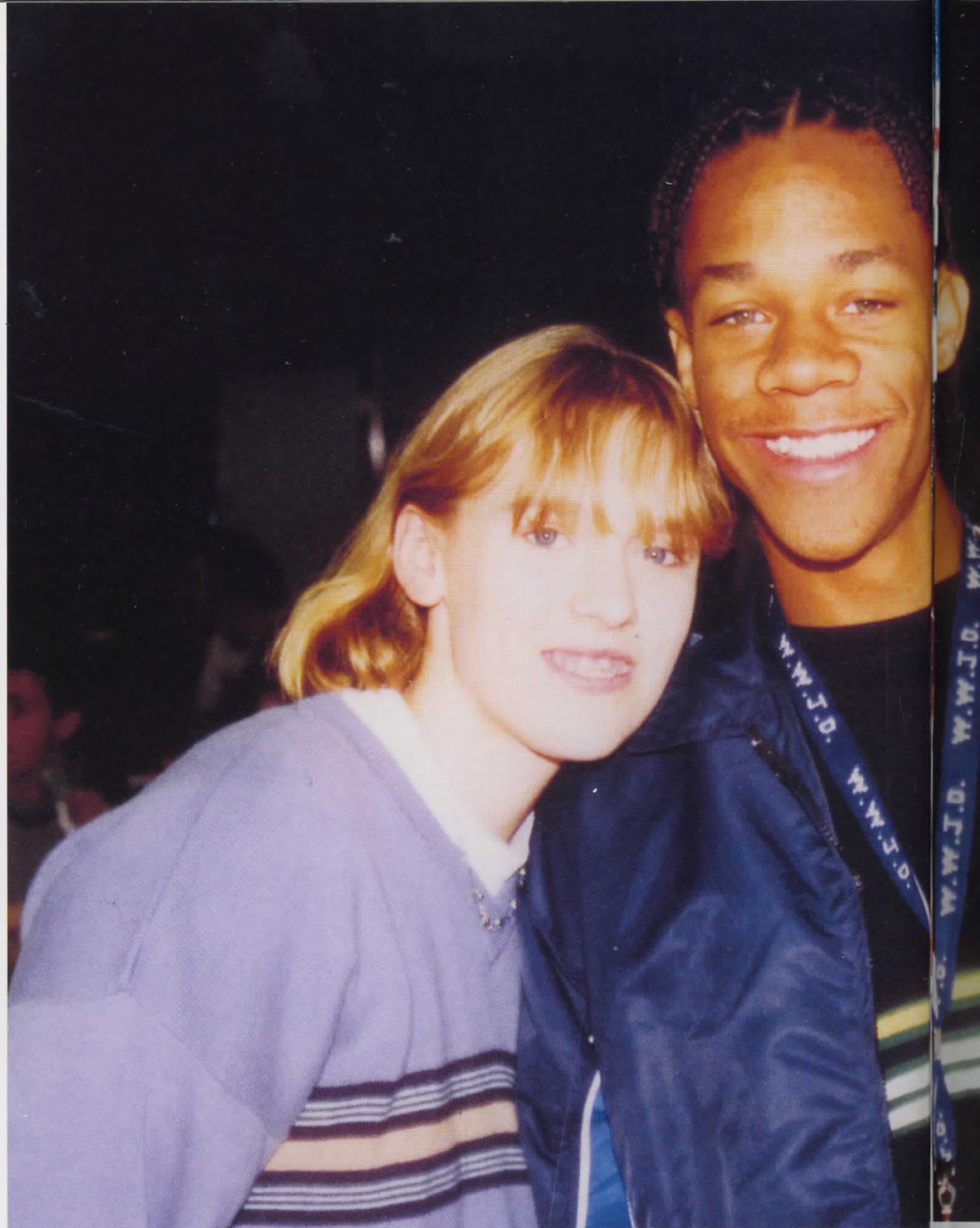

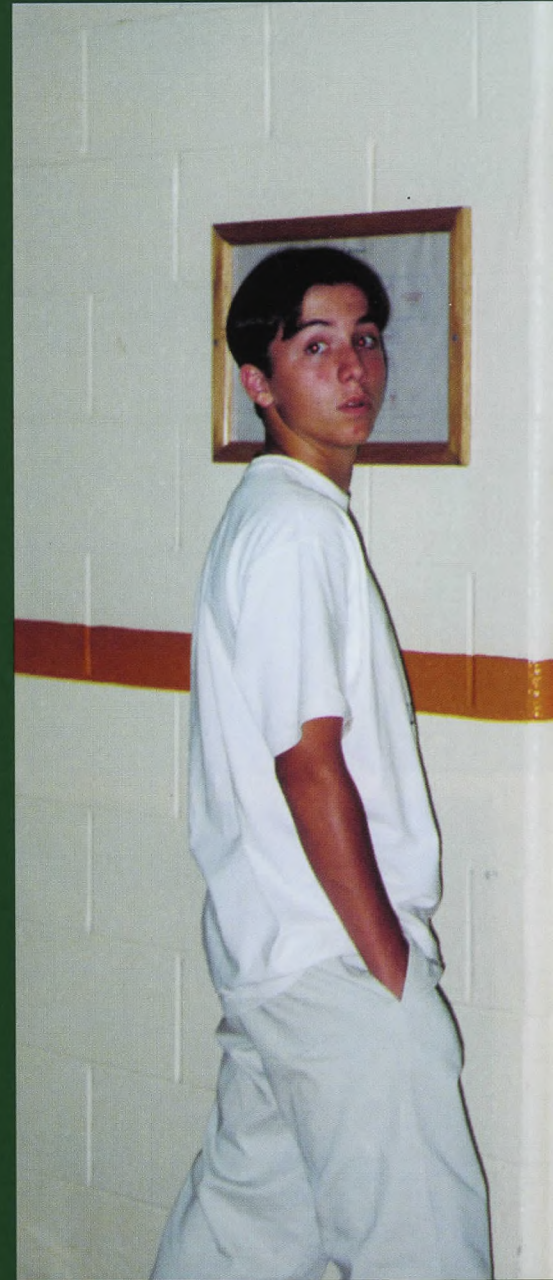

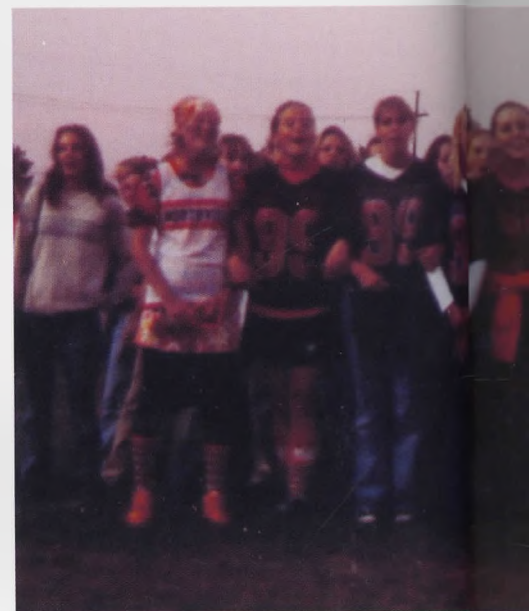

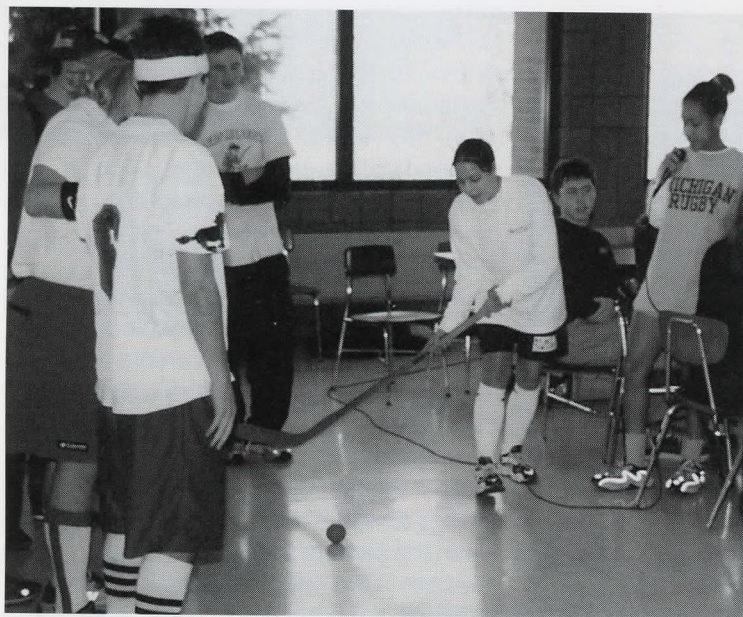

Sports are an easy way for teachers to relieve stress. For example, Mr. Cunningham plays in both basketball and softball leagues, but not during the same season.

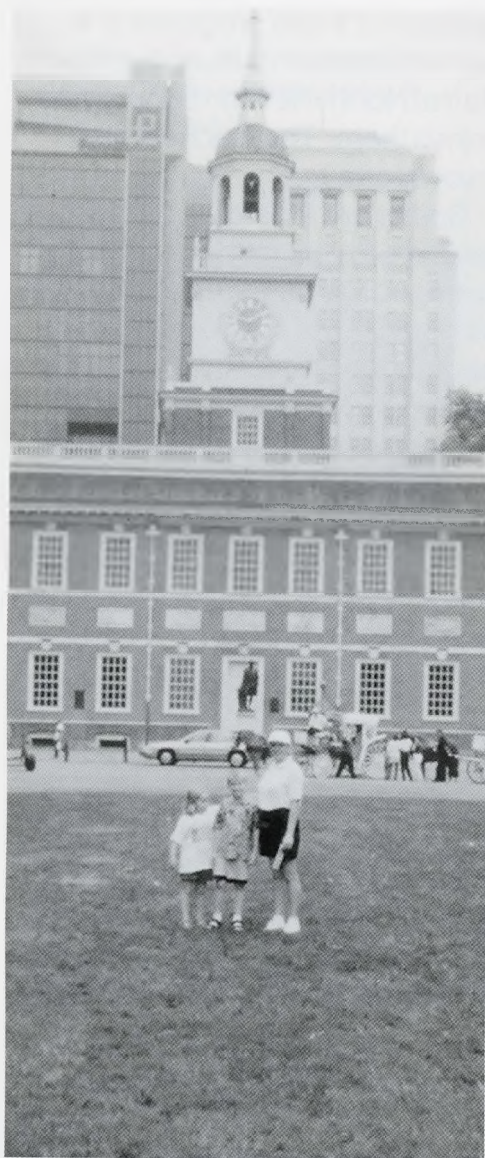
Clearly, teachers do have a life outside of school. So chances are if they are not checking homework, they might be out having fun by enjoying their hobby.

On May 7, the seniors enjoyed a beautiful, fun-filled prom at the Hyatt Regency in Dearborn.

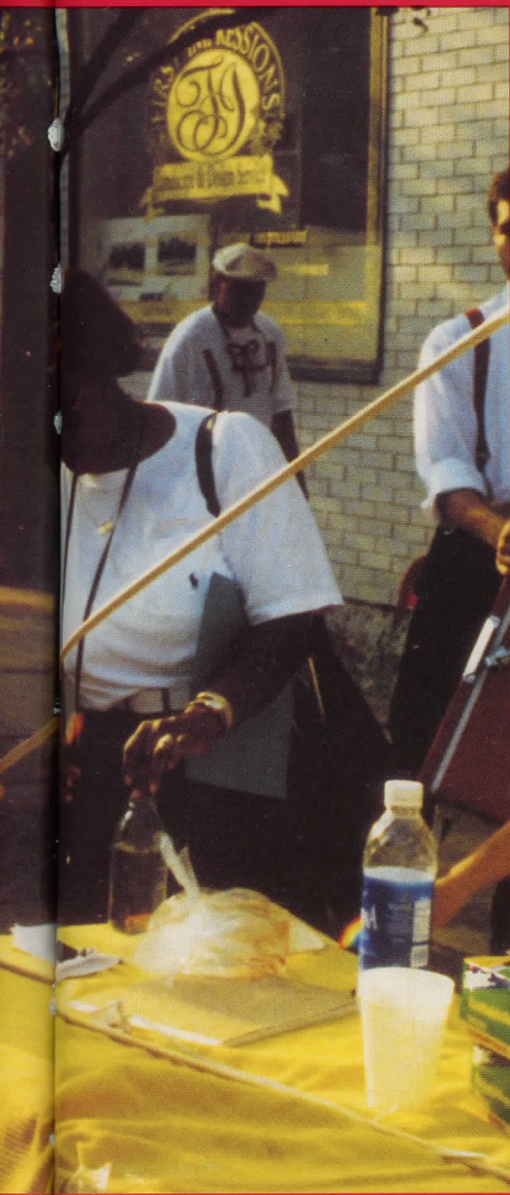

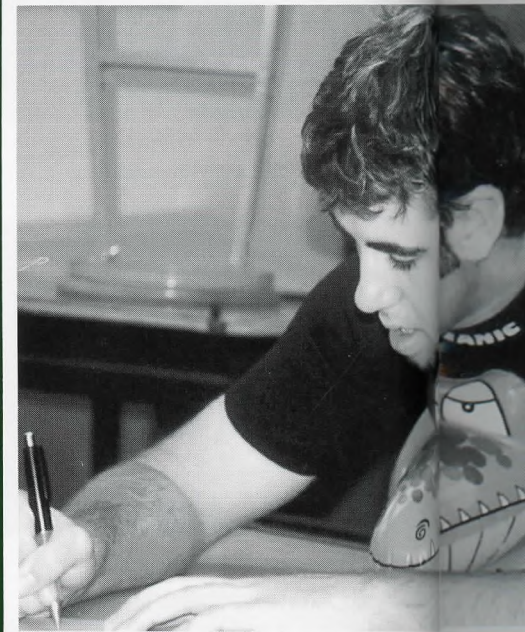
Yearlings

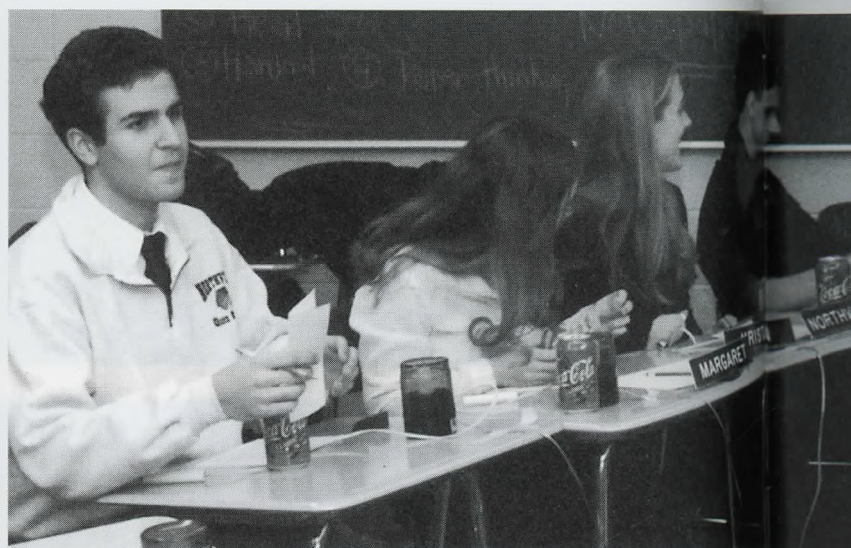
Organizations

Deciding on the theme of "Under the Sea," Student Congress made Homecoming '98 a festive week. Each day was filled with anticipation of the daily activities and class competitions.

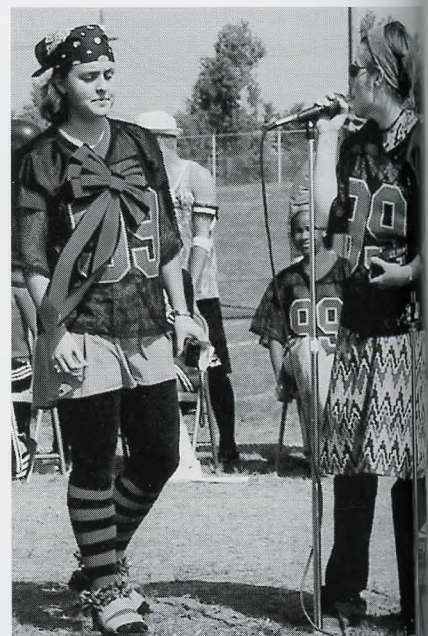
Student Congress also held fund-raisers throughout the year to fund their activities such as

Paint the Town and Student Exchange by selling key chains and Homecoming tickets.

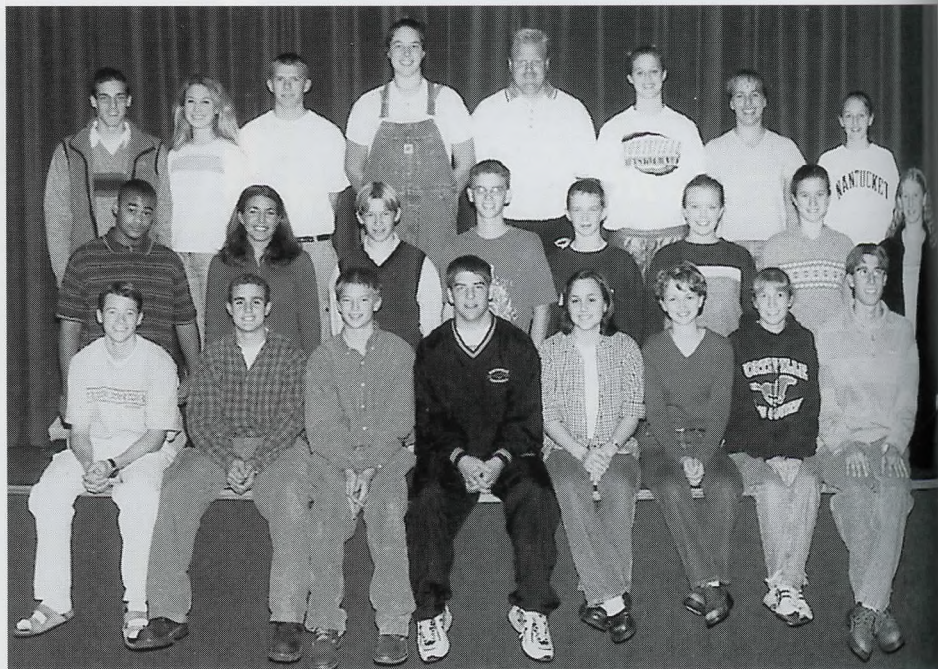
Continuing their service to NHS, Student Congress cleaned and painted the math hall bathrooms, following last year's painting of the bathrooms in the English hall.

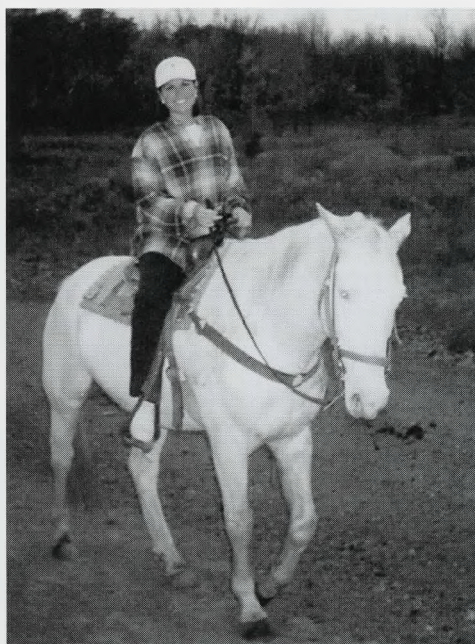

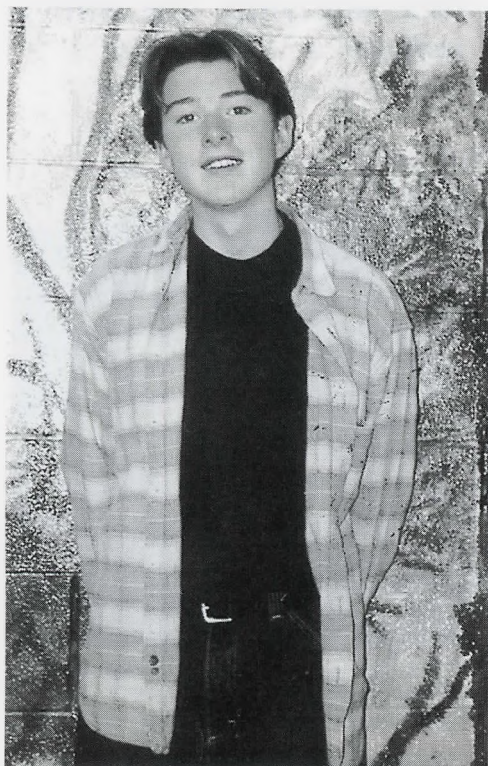
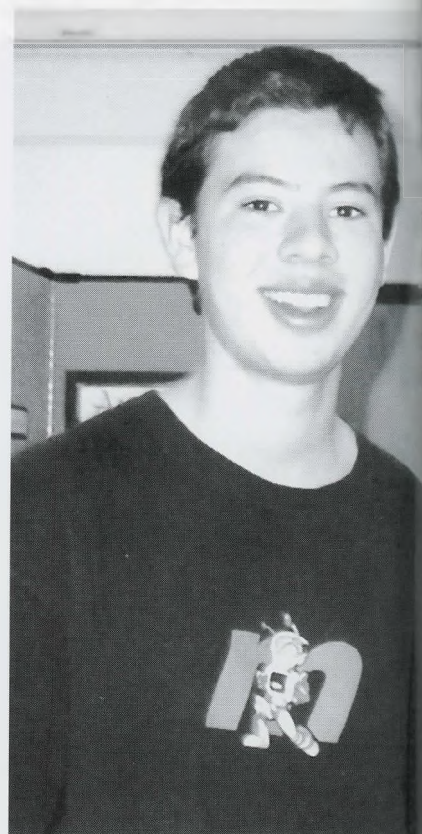
Foreign Exchange Students

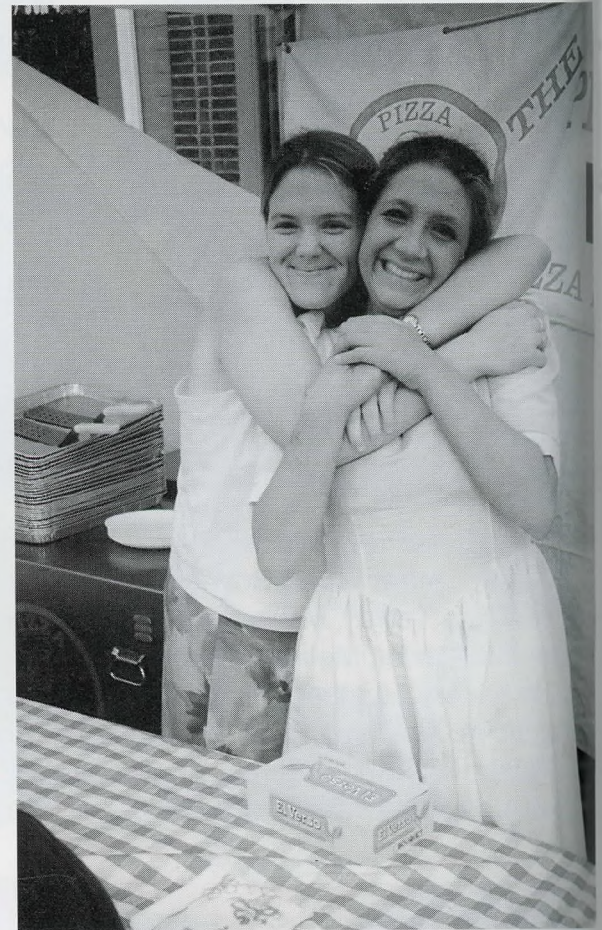
S.A.D.D.

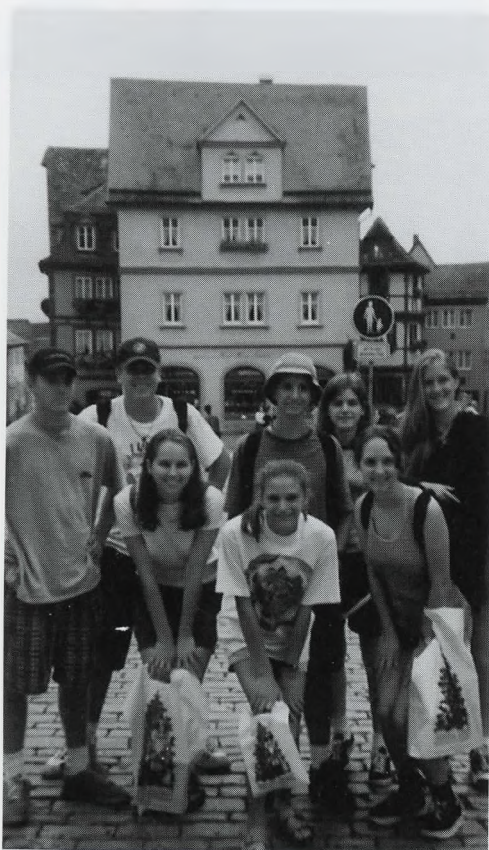

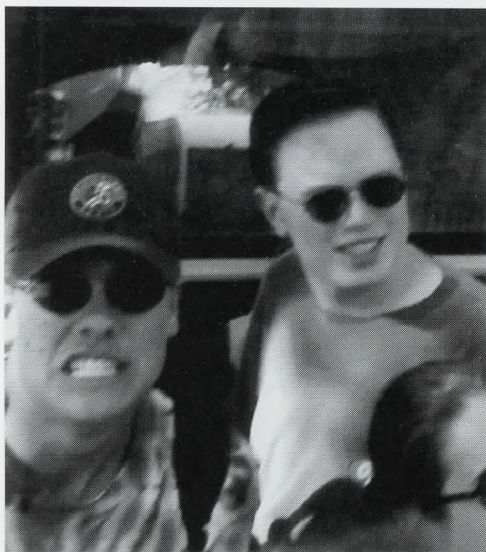

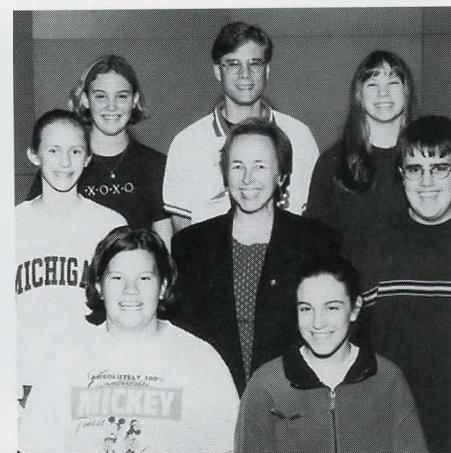

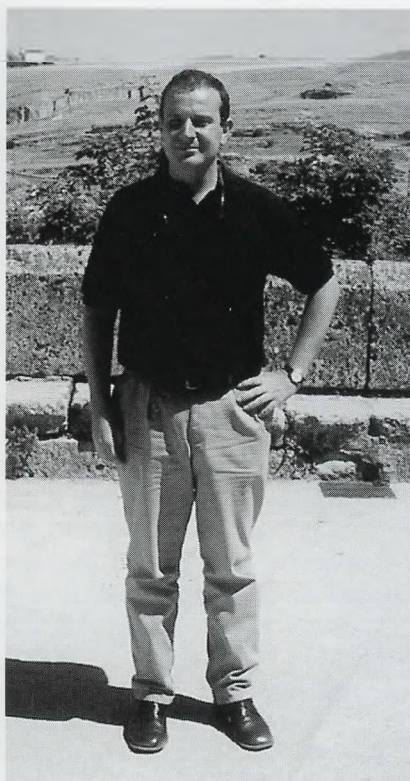

Last year there were only a handful of people on the yearbook staff, so this year's new Publications class was definitely a lifesaver. The class

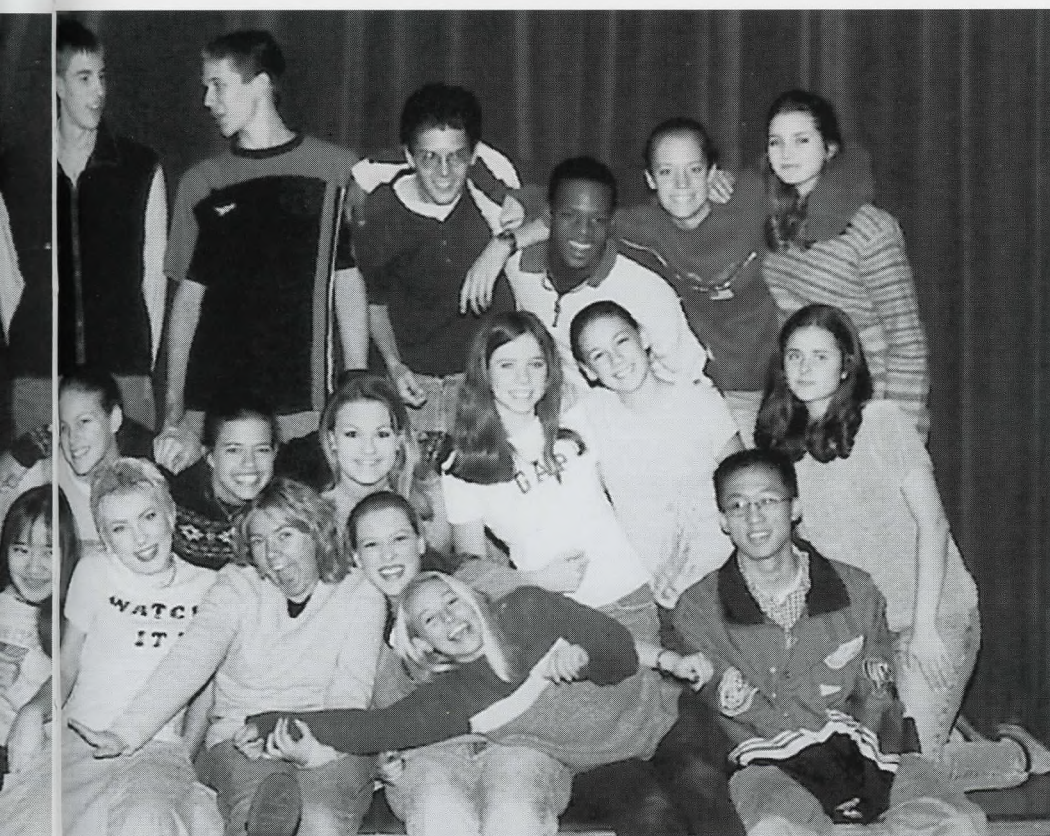

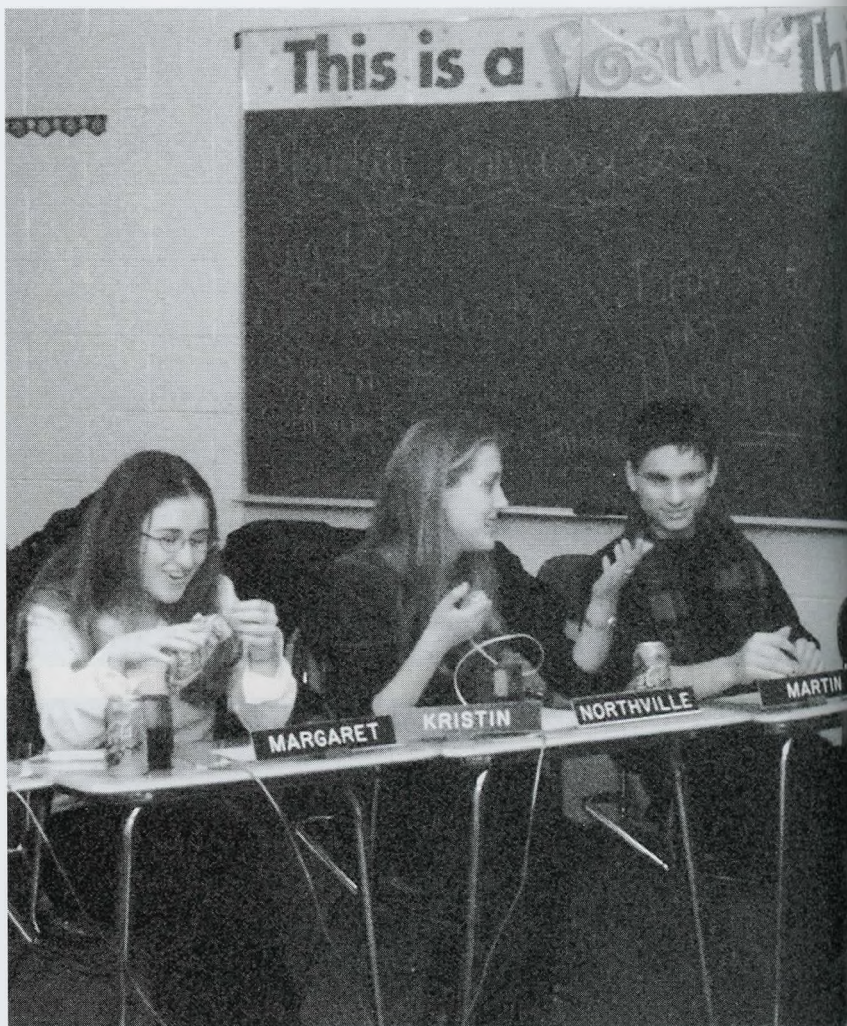

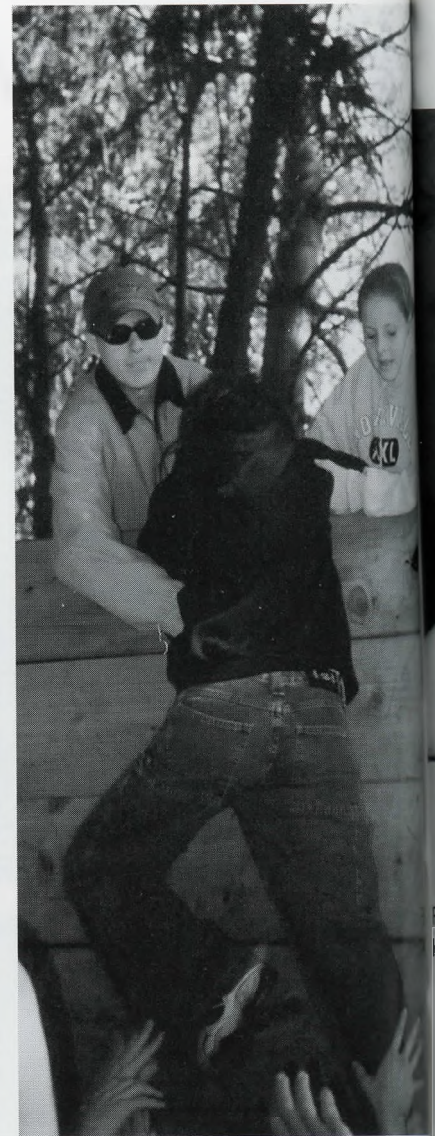

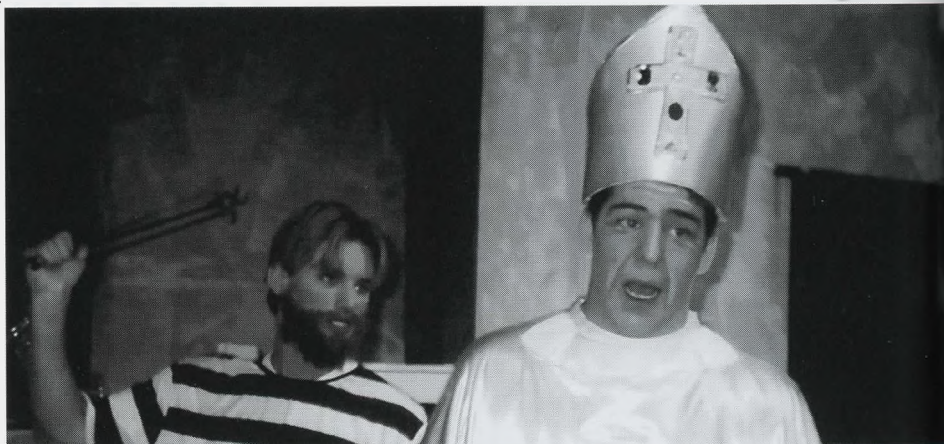
On Saturday, November 21, the cast and crew of the fall play, "See How They Run" took their final bows. It was an end to wonderful performances that took place on both sides of the curtain.

The 25-year-old script was very challenging and could have been interpreted in any number of ways. There was also much pressure on the performers due to the success of last year's "Nothing But the Truth."

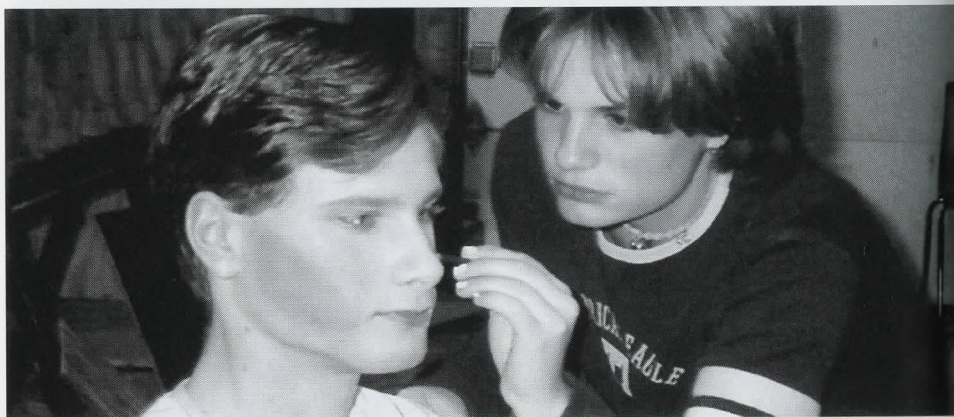

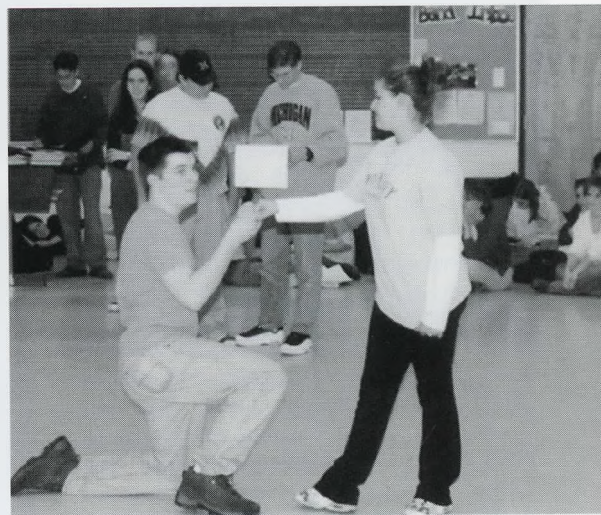
Spring Musical

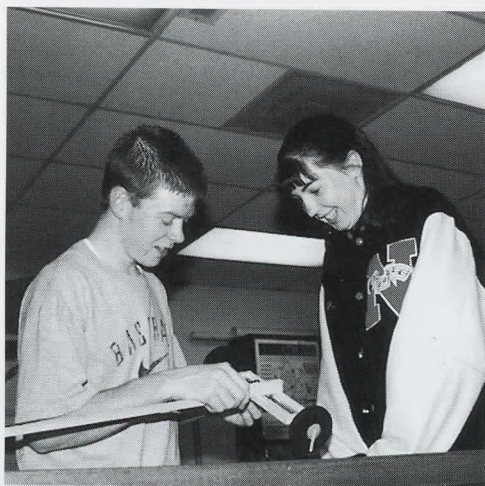
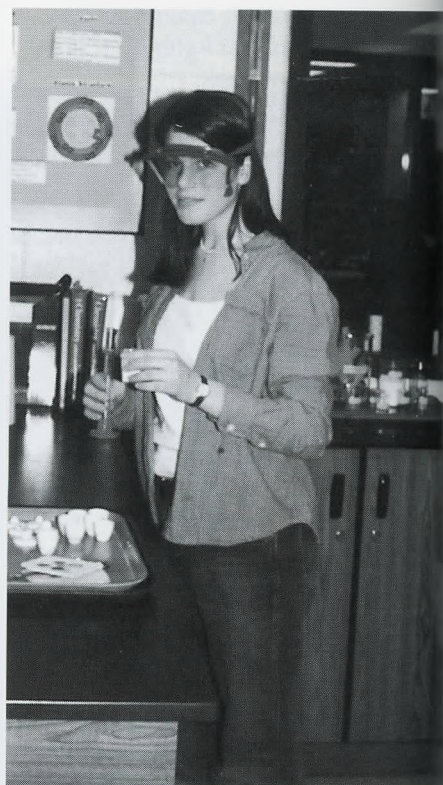
Science Olympiad

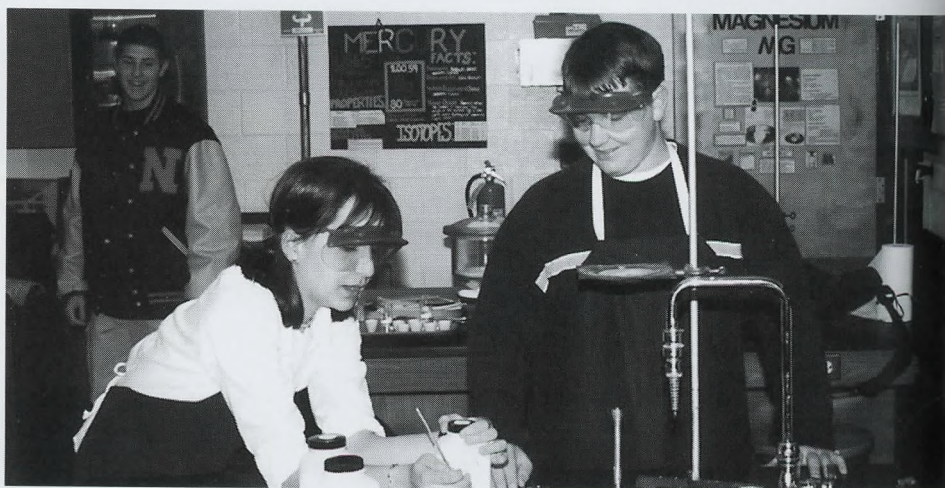

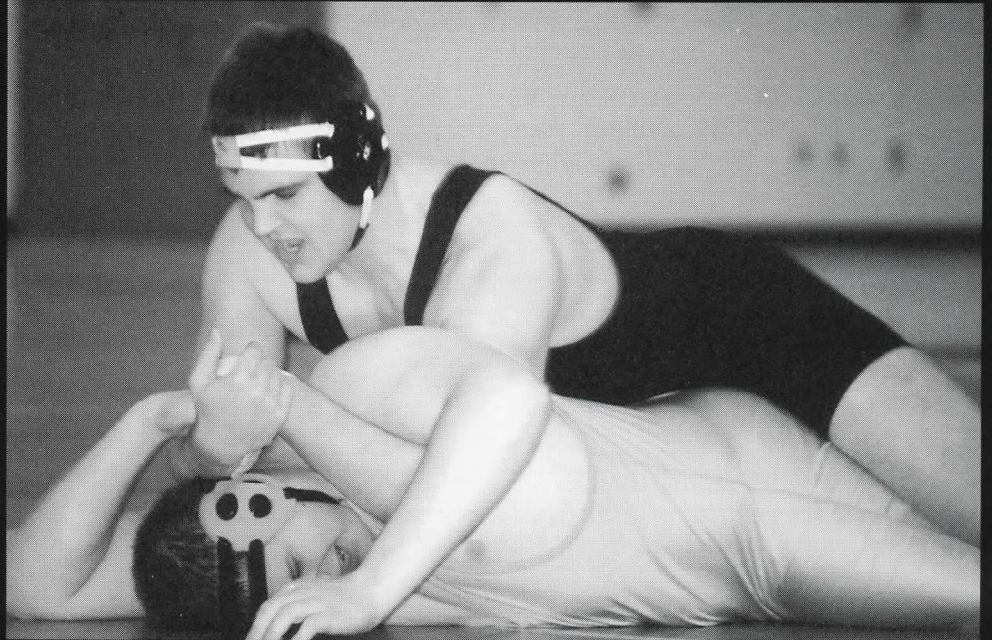

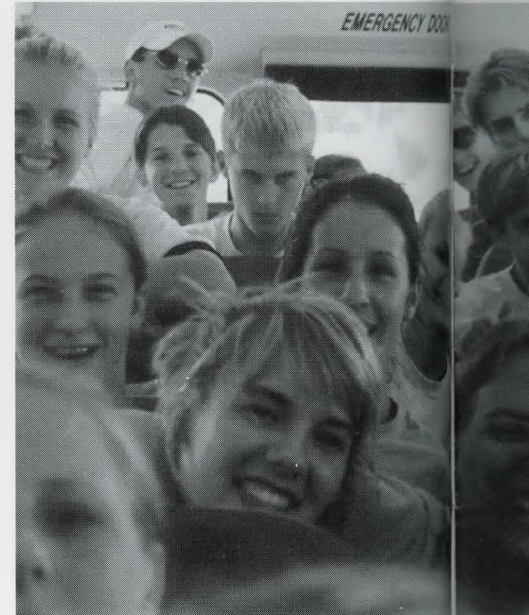
CROSS COUNTRY IS KICKIN' IT IN!

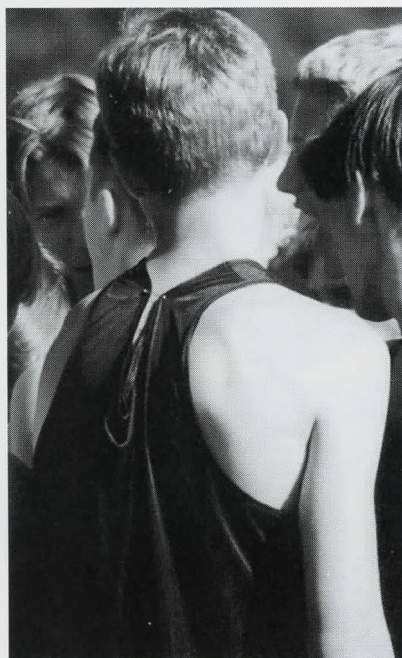

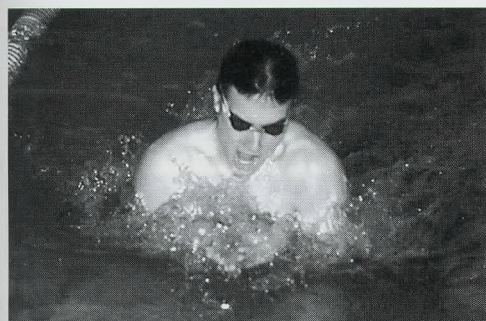
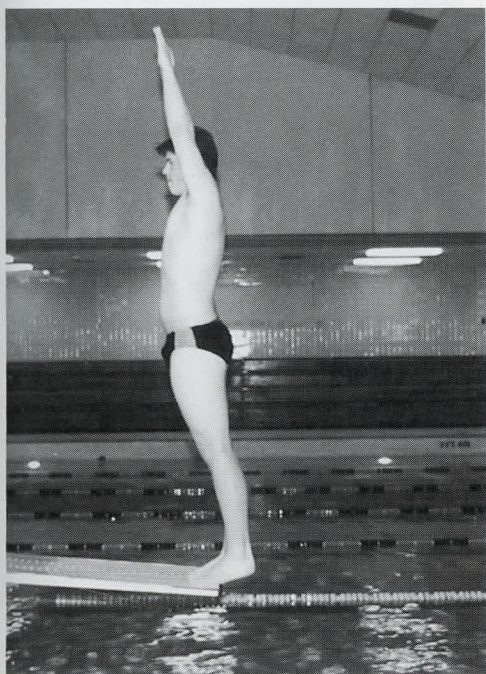

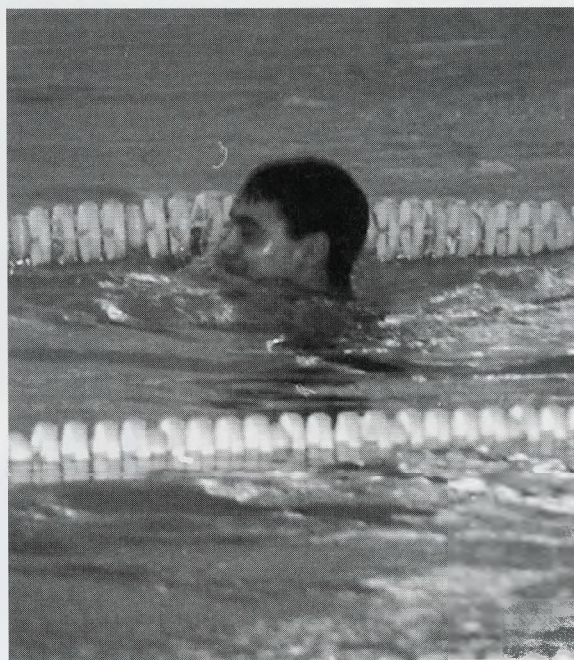

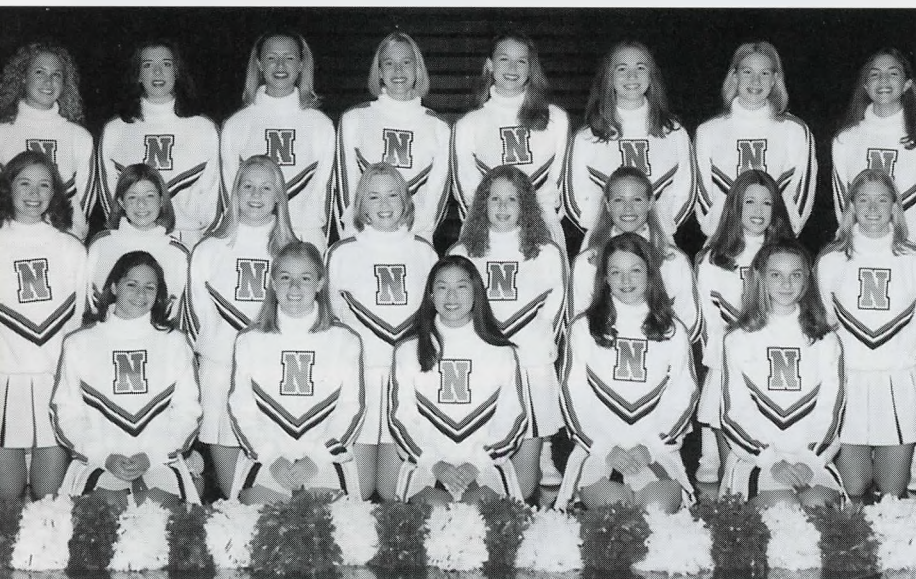

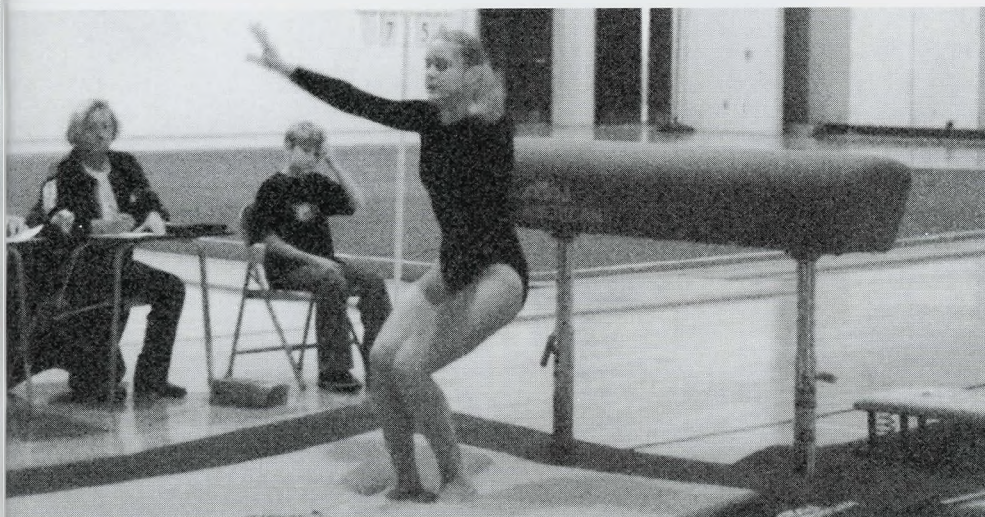

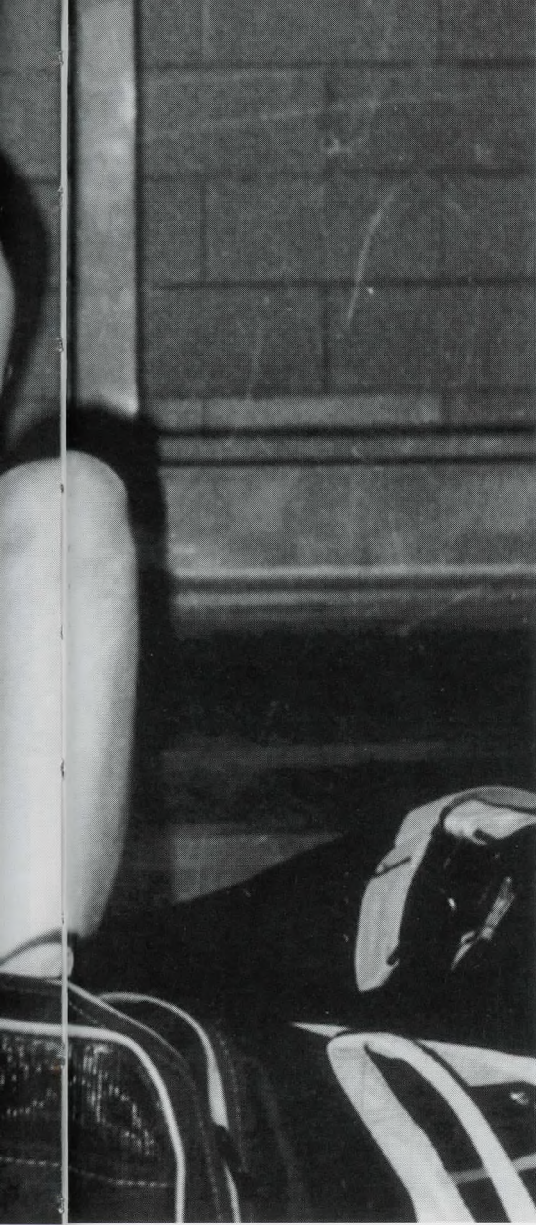

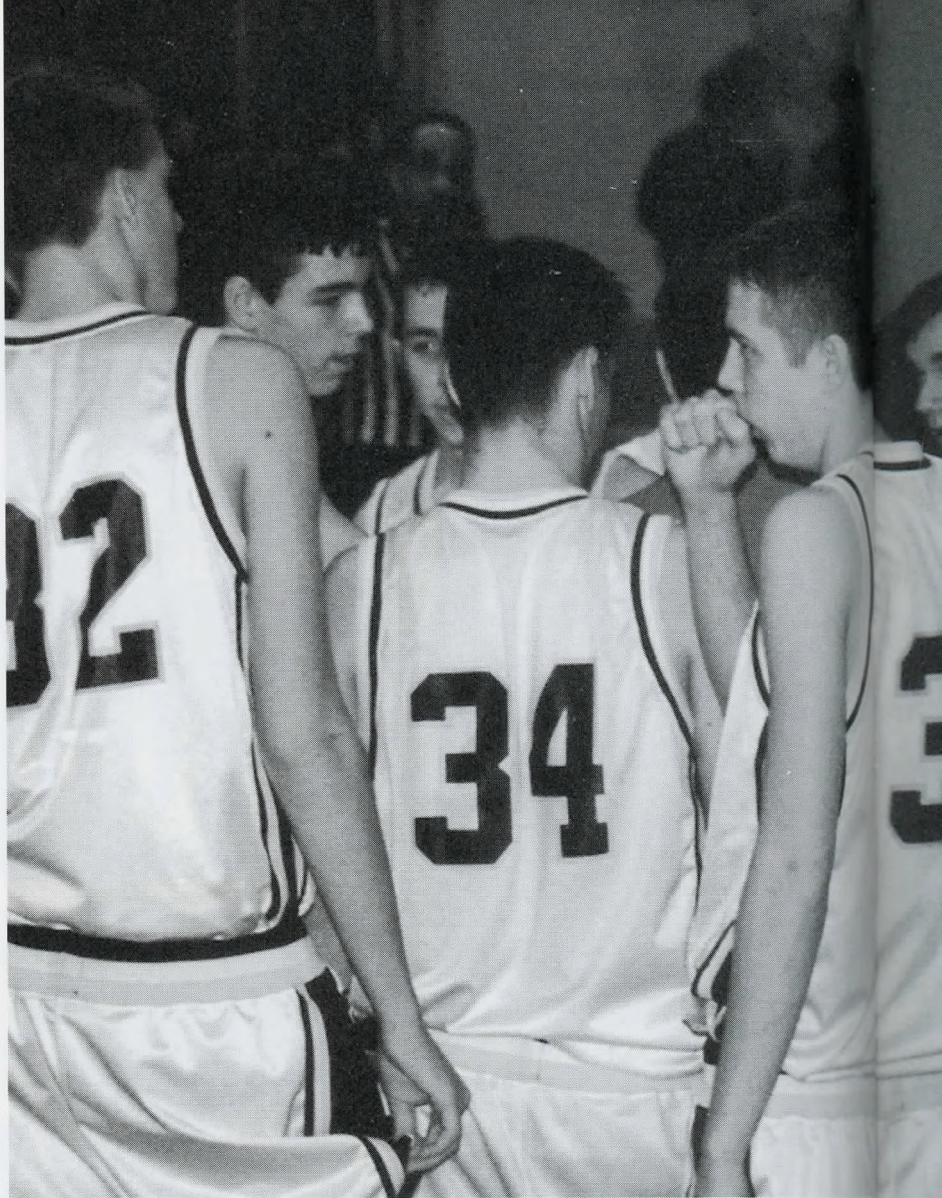

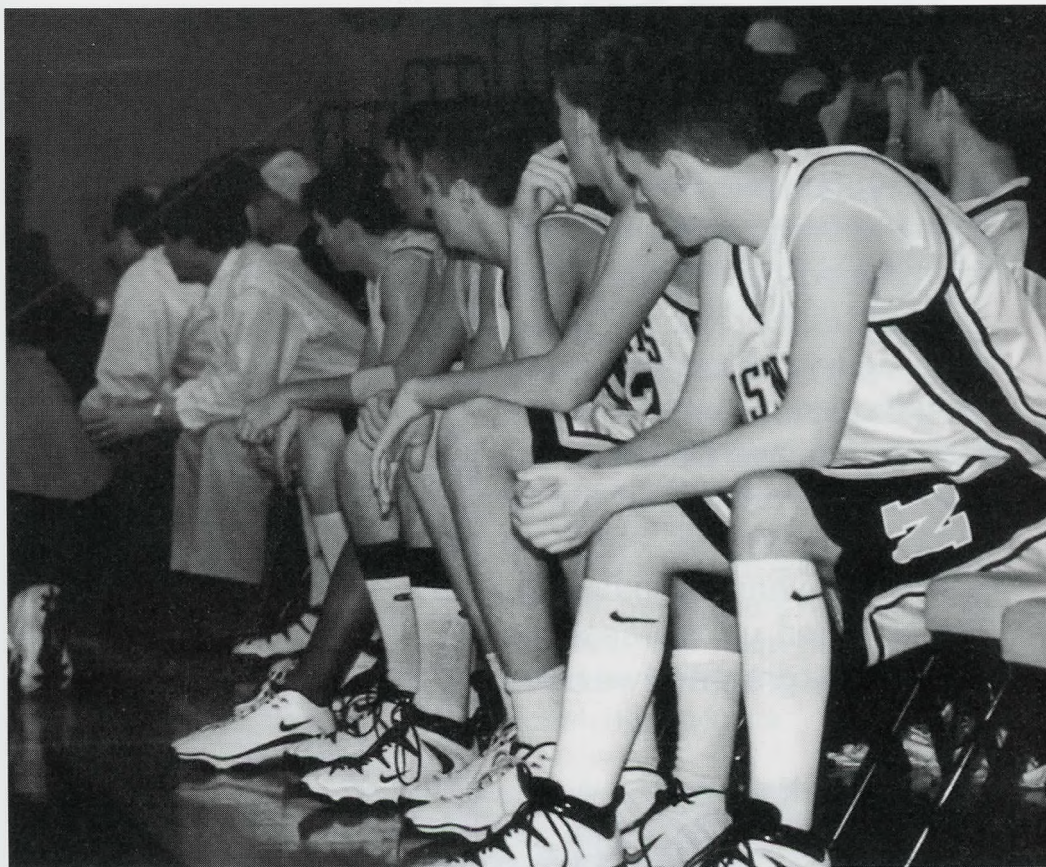

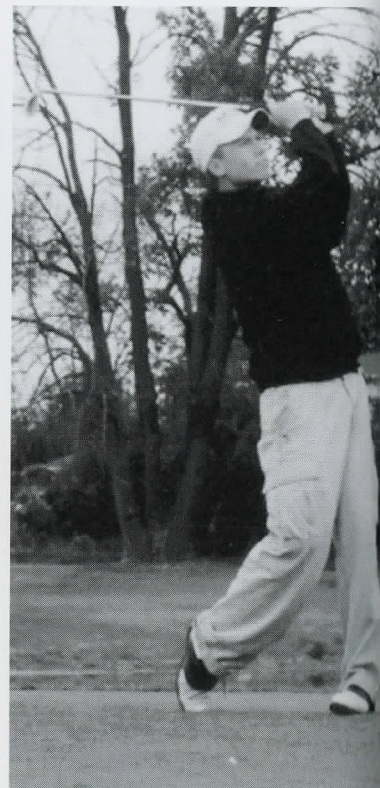
MEN'S GOLF

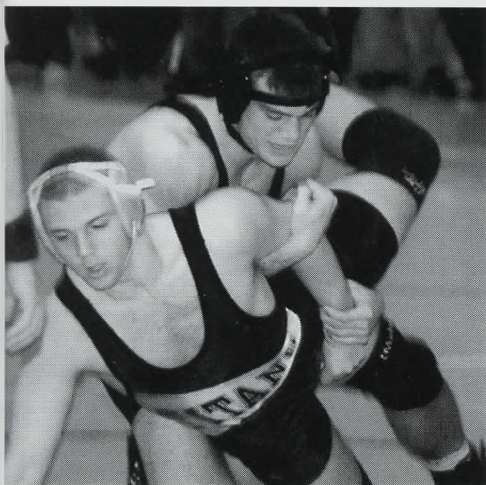
WRESTLING

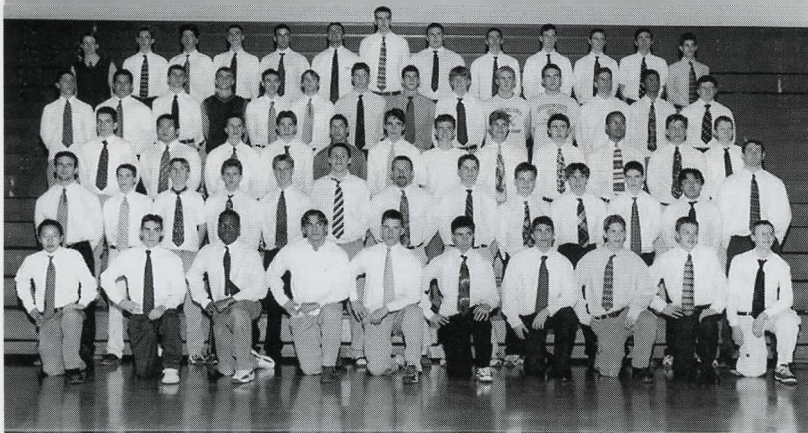
Women's

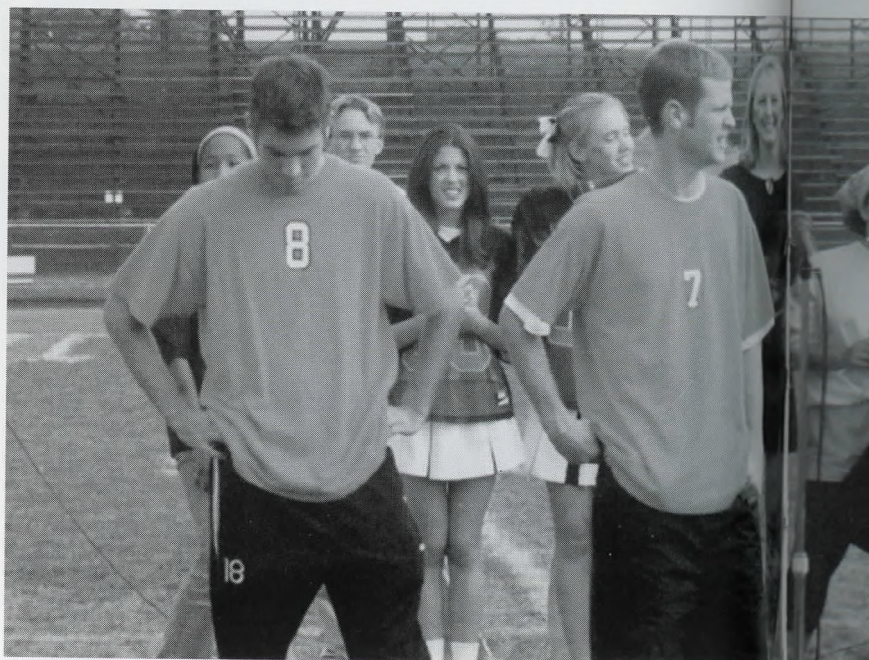

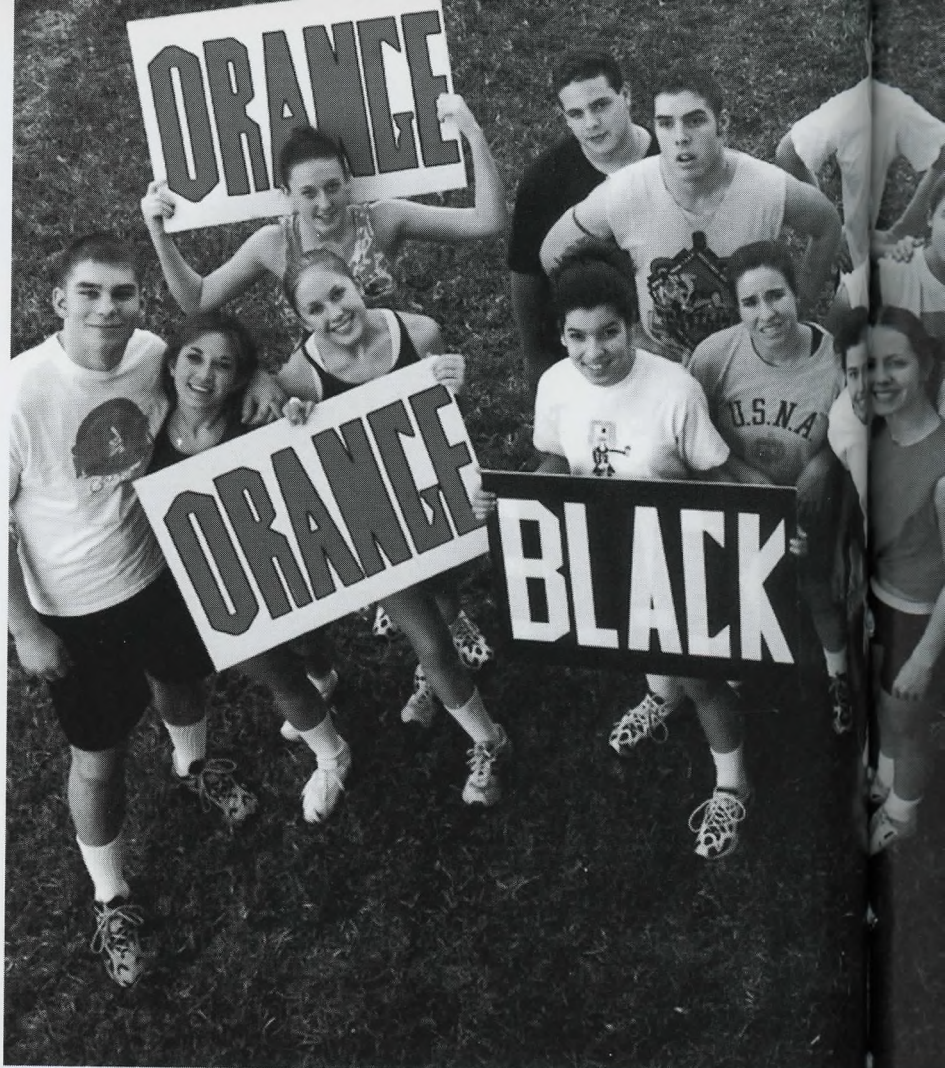

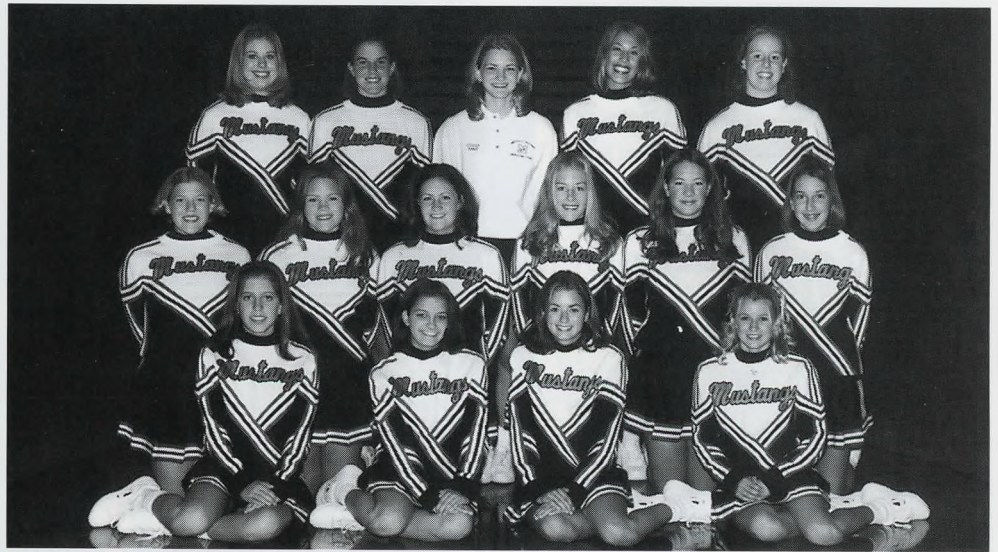

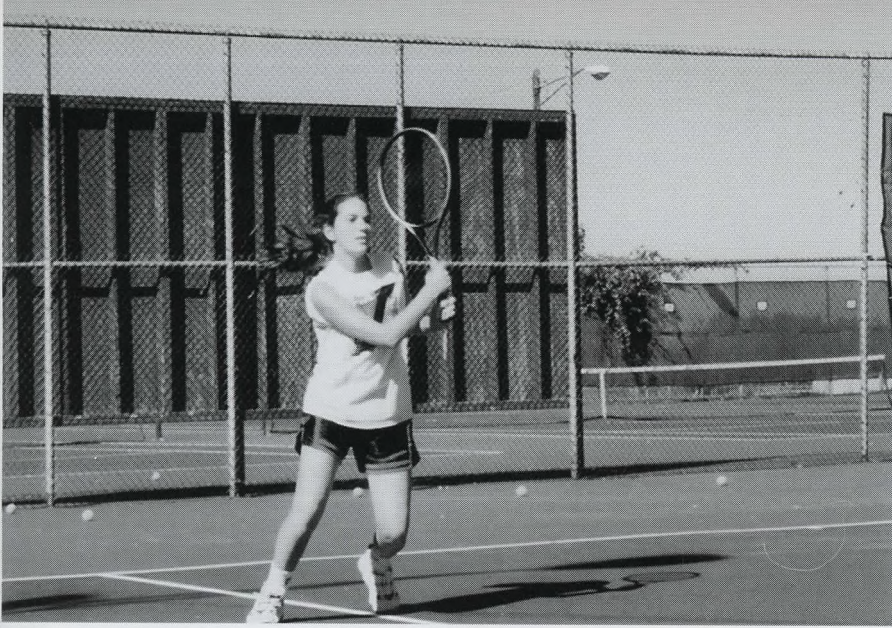

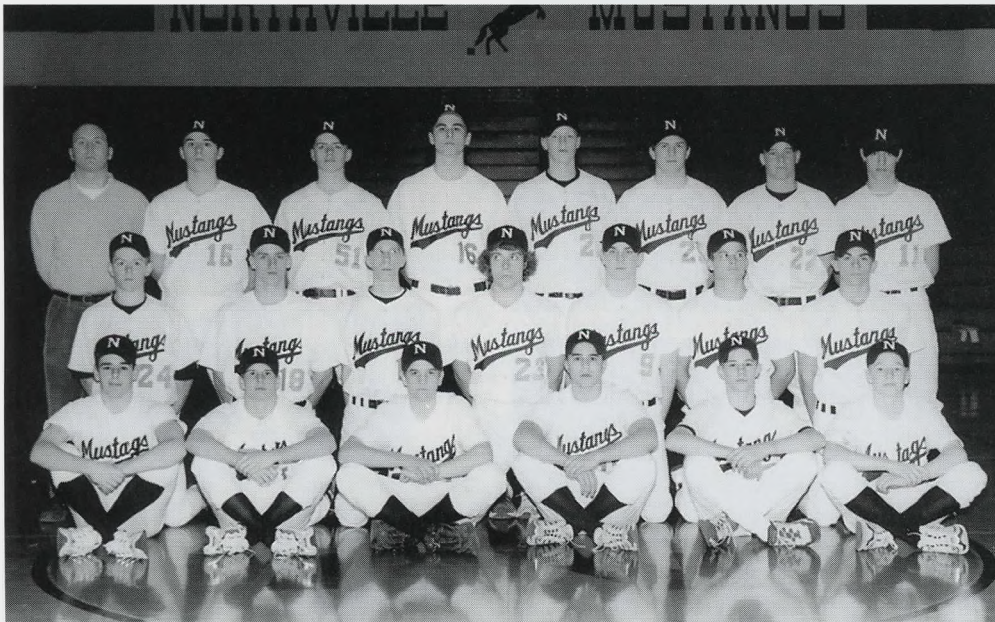

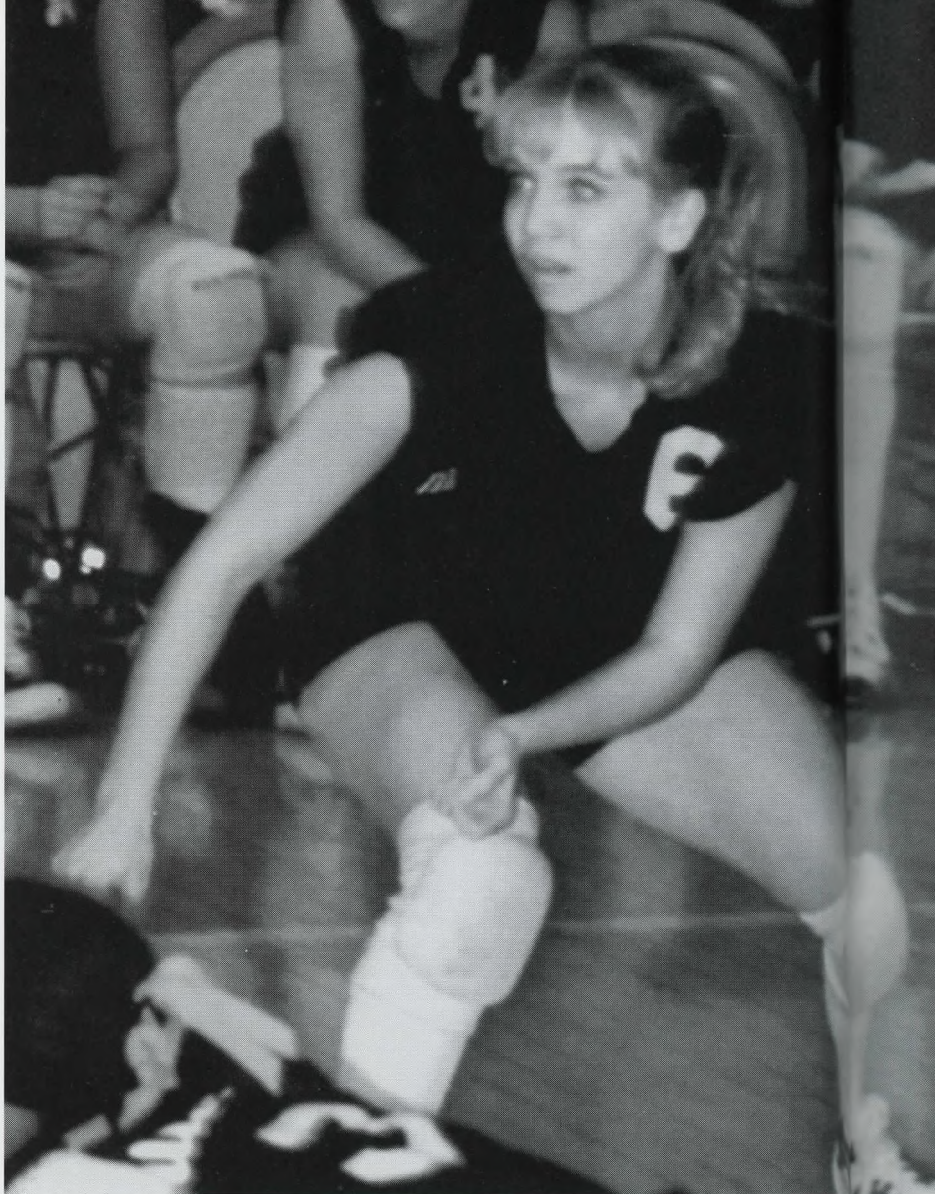
