Many memories are made because of the time spent with friends. Even though friends will come and go, the memories will always remain.

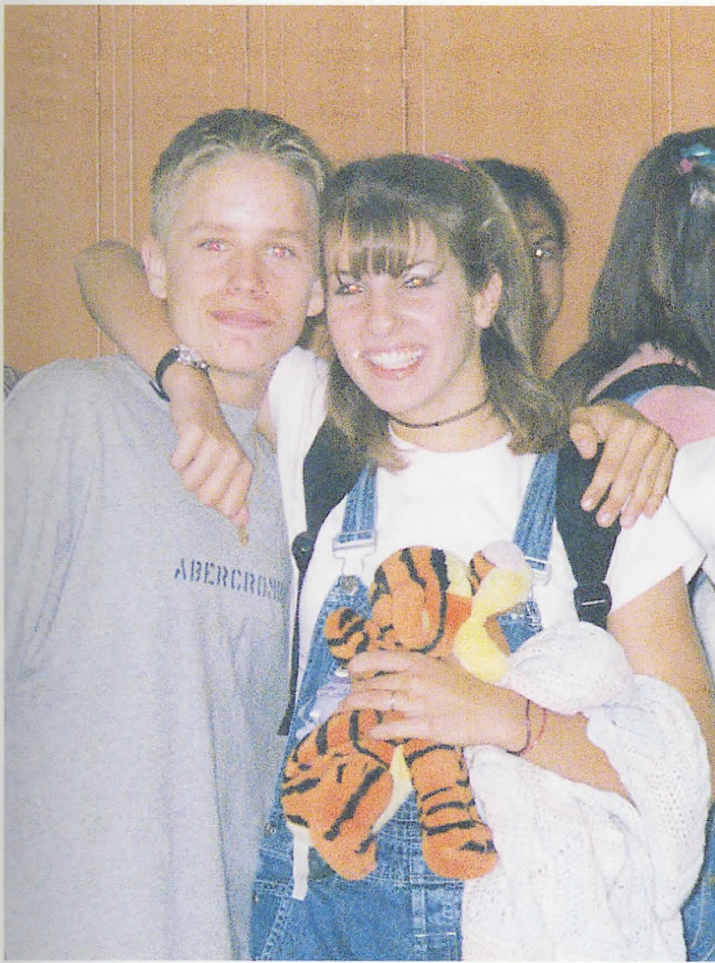

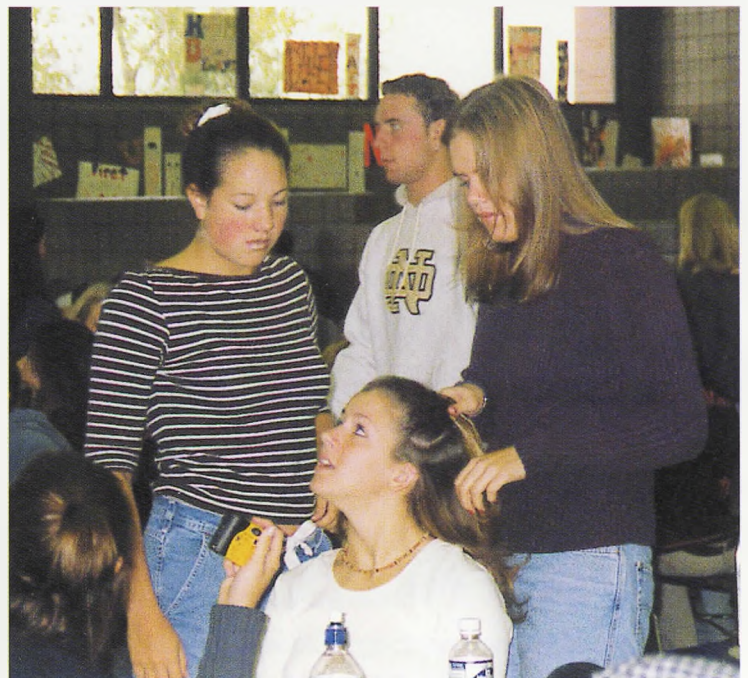

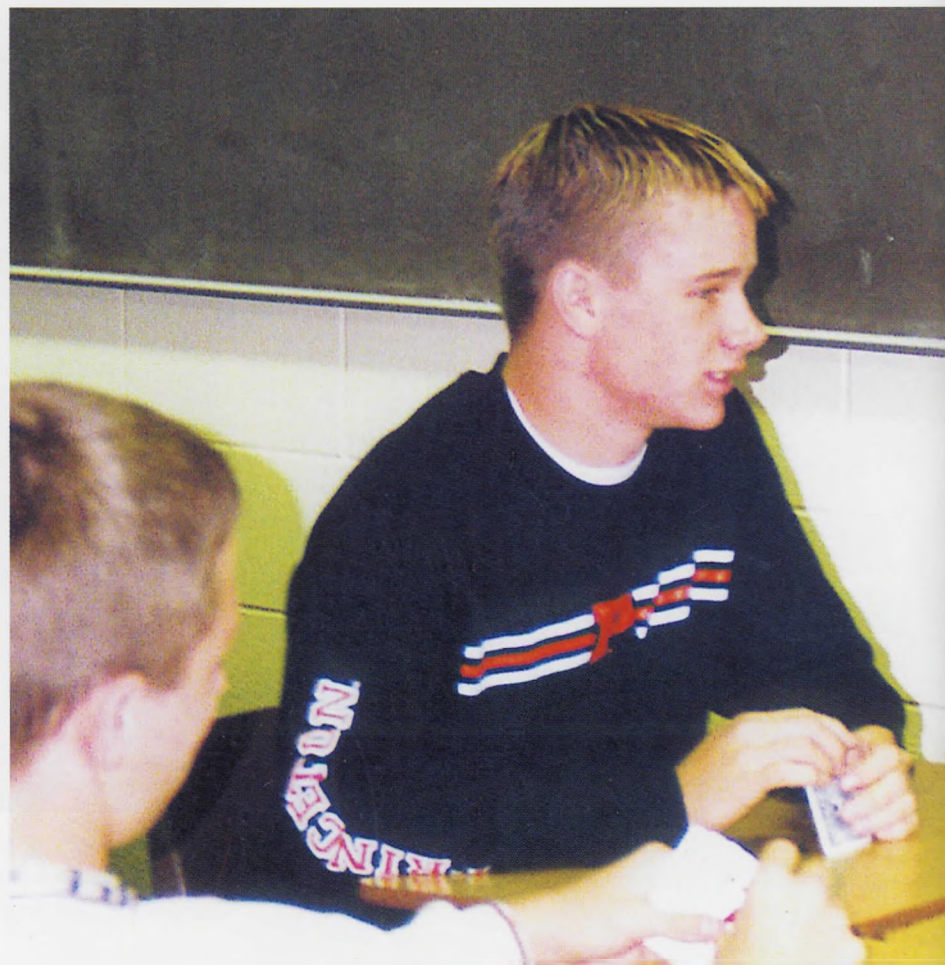
Despite its minor faults, students unanimously agree that seminar is a major convenience and has allowed them to be more flexible with their busy schedules.

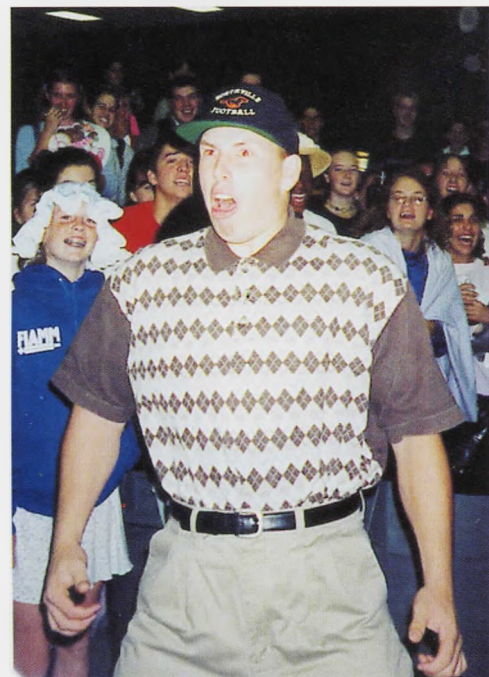

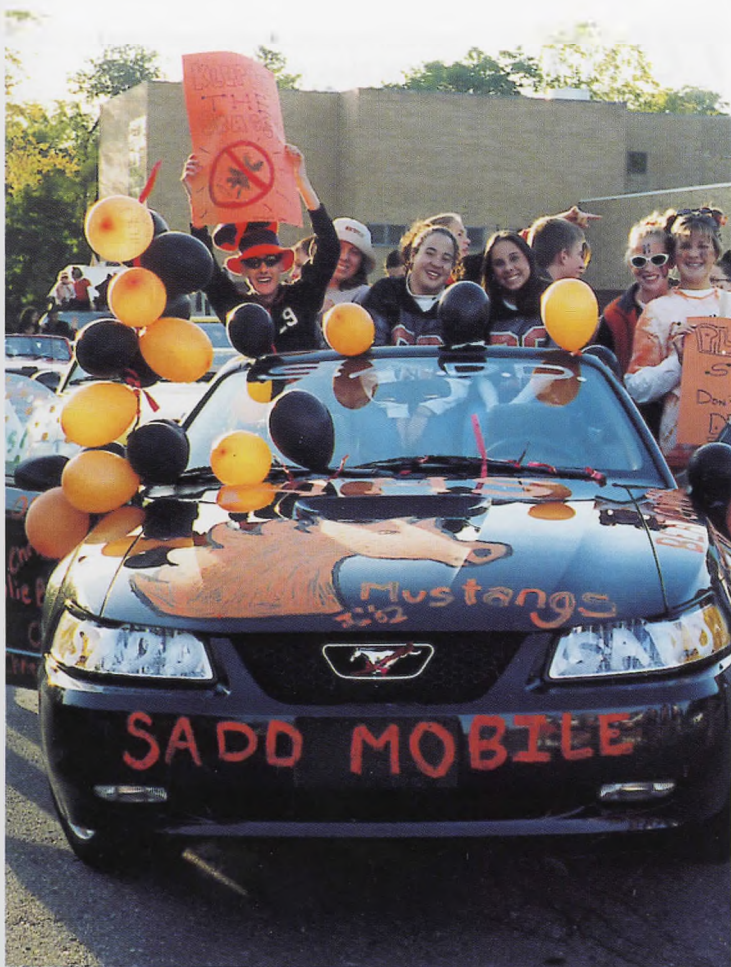

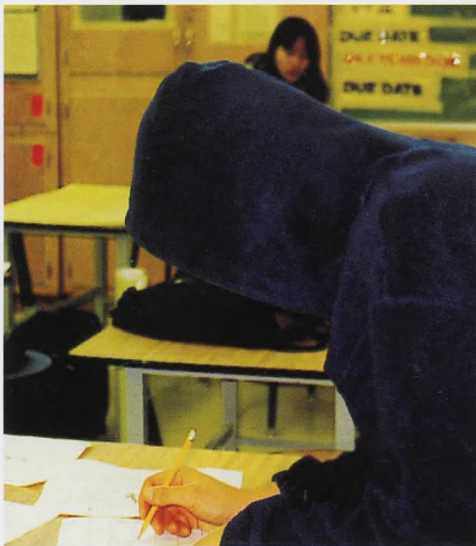
At the end of a long day, these NHS students hurry to catch their busses. Everyone who had to take the bus will miss the mad rushes across the bridge.

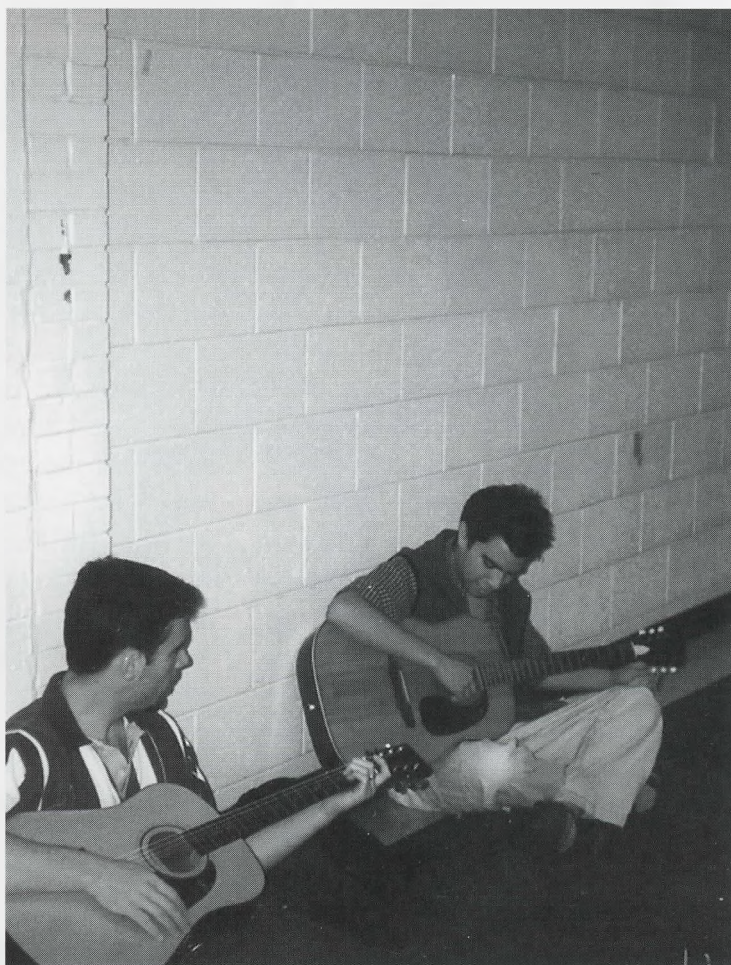

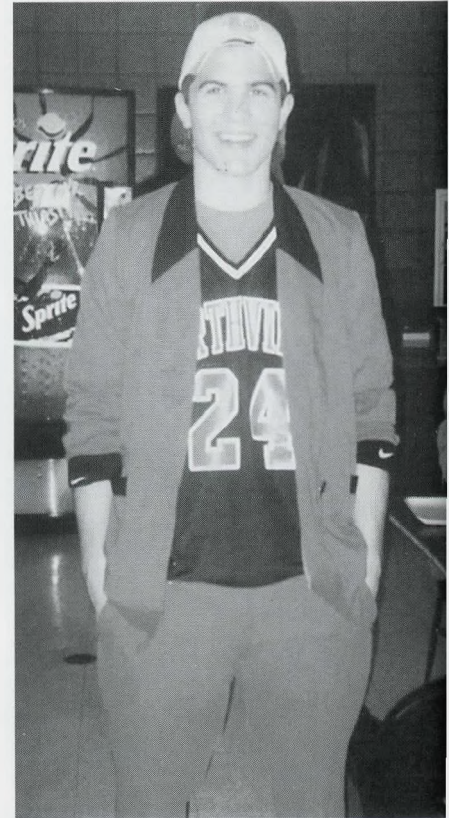

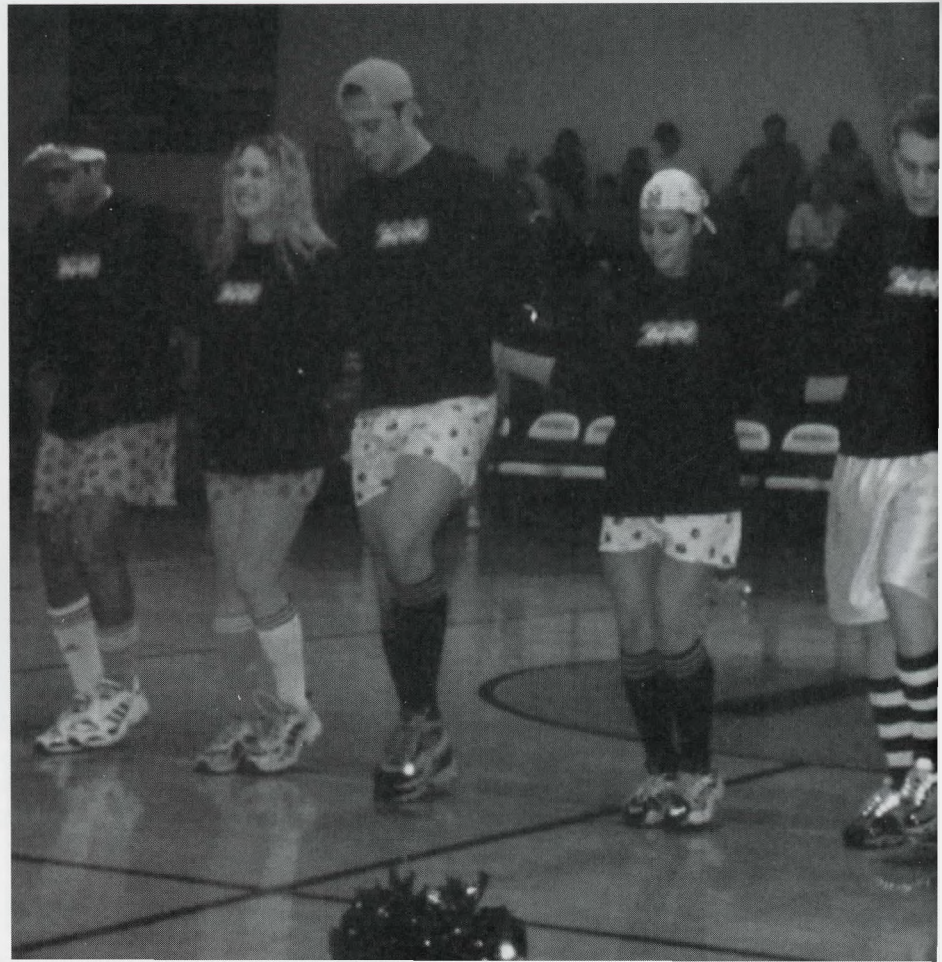

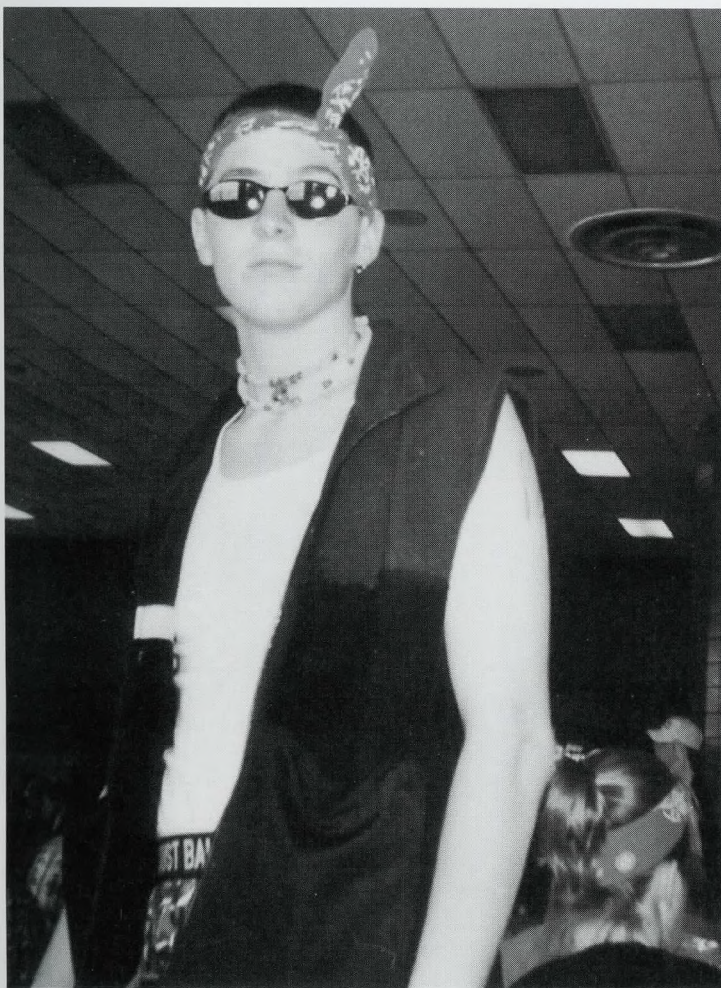

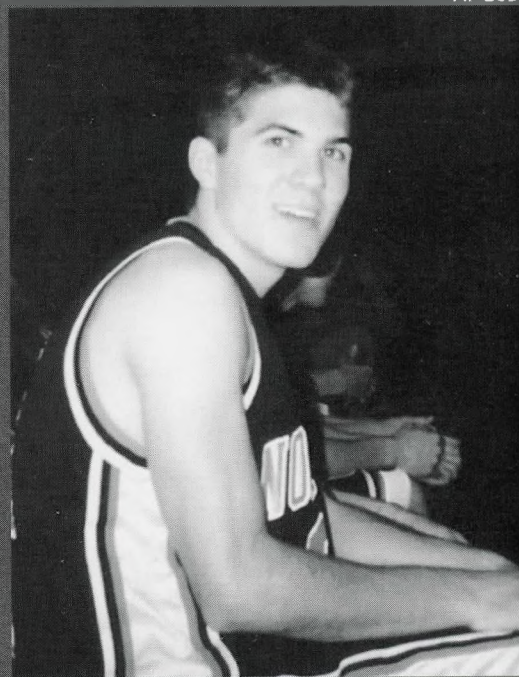

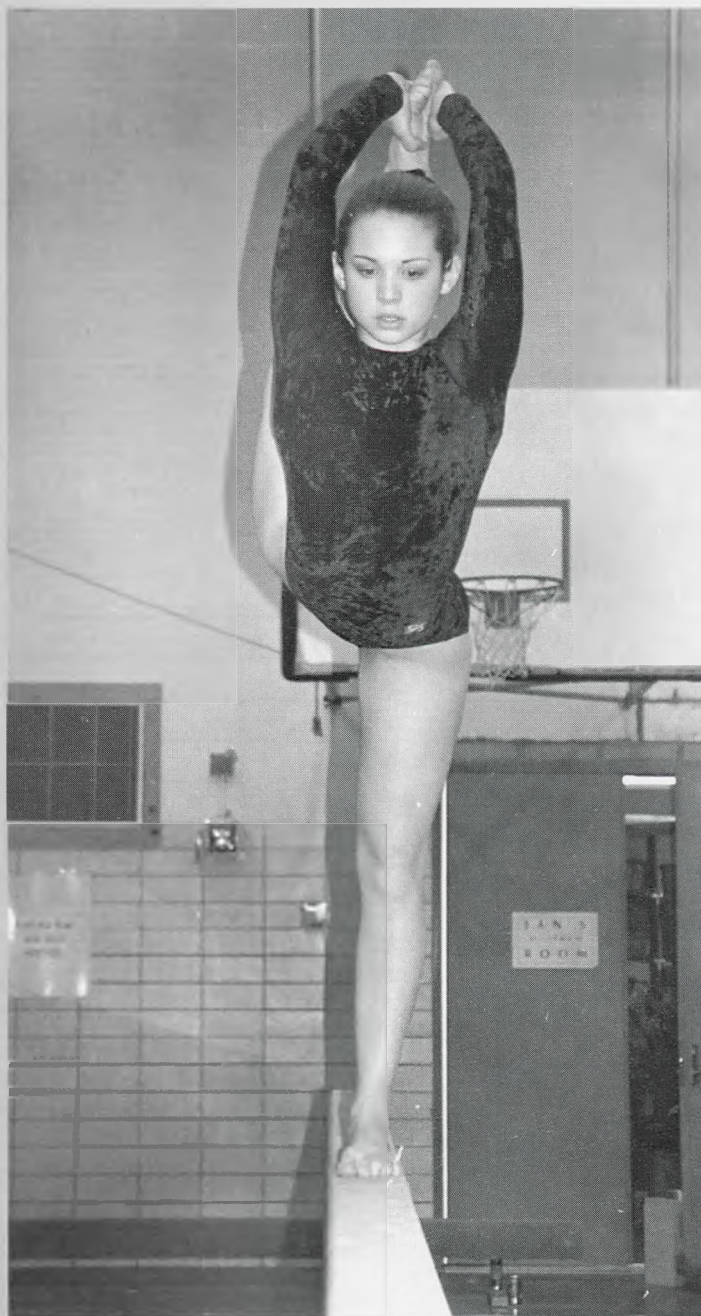

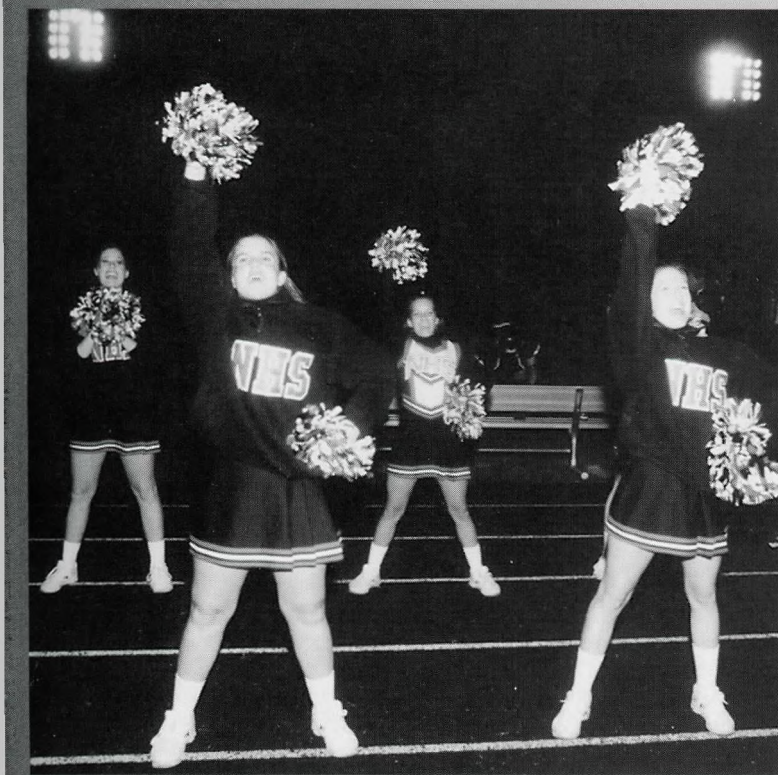

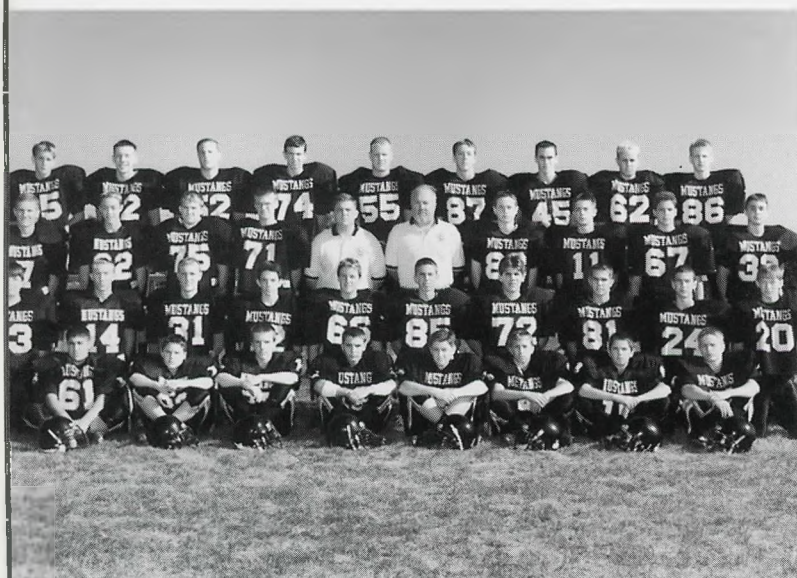
receptions and passing yards.

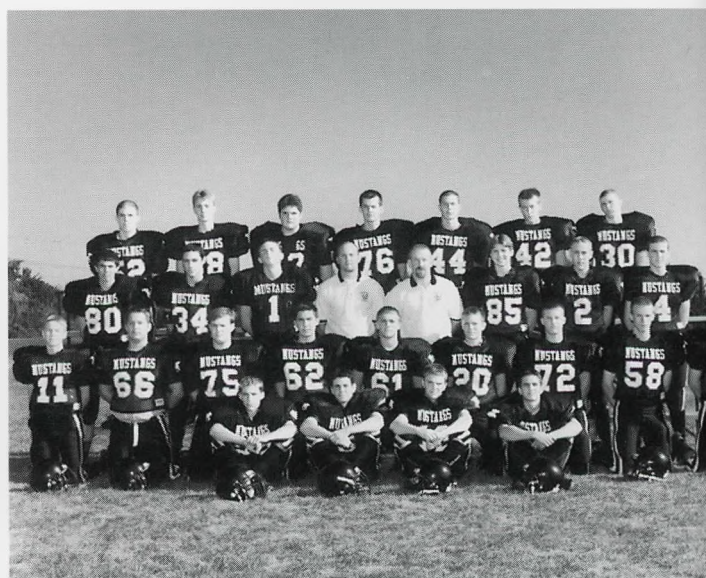
Captain Steve Klein summed up the season with, "We had a successful year and I'm happy all of the seniors went out on a good note."

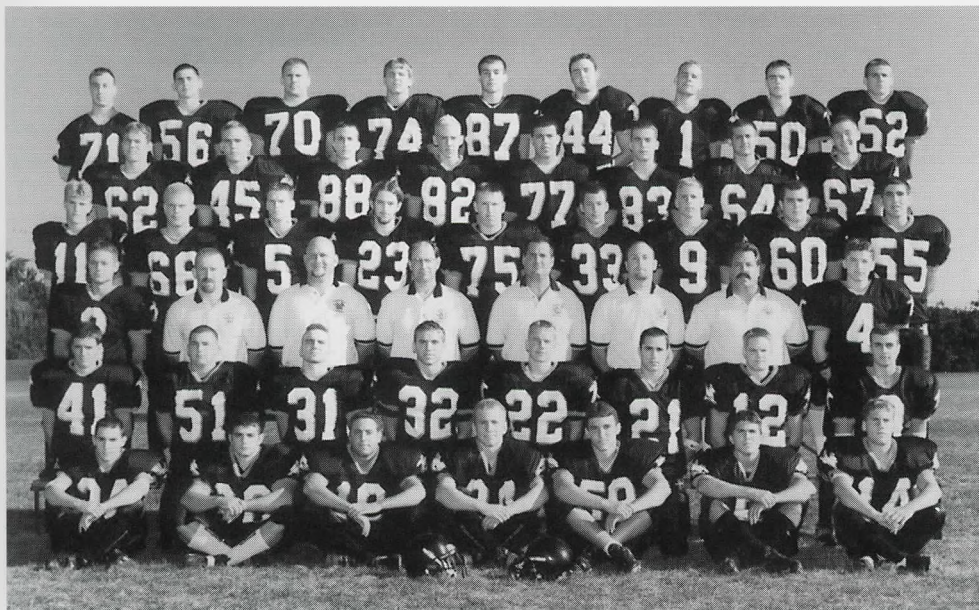

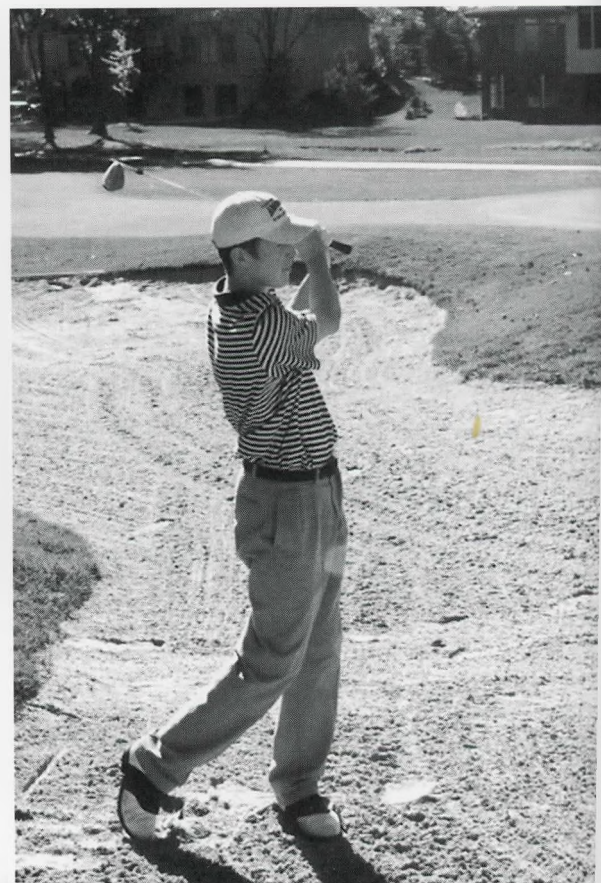

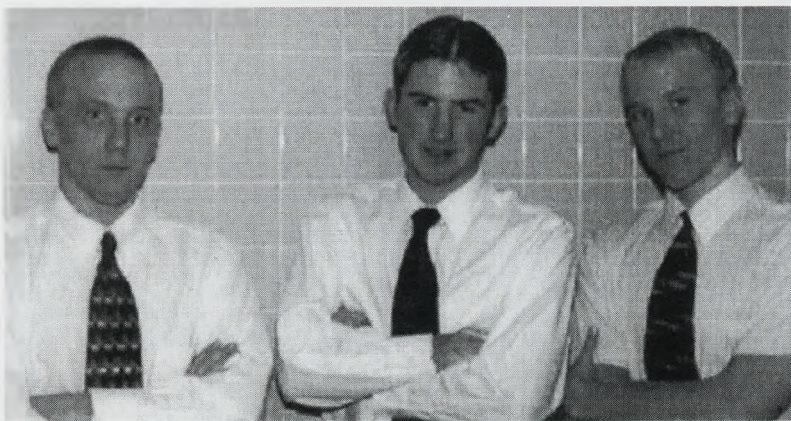

qualified the team to compete in the National High School Cheerleading championship held in Orlando, Florida.

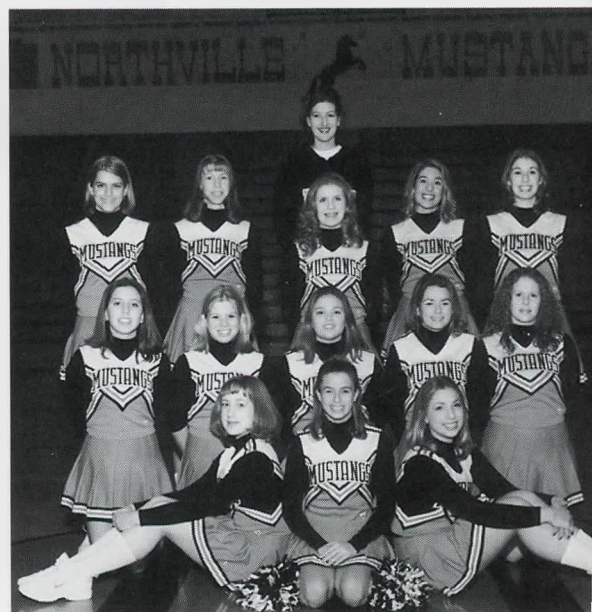

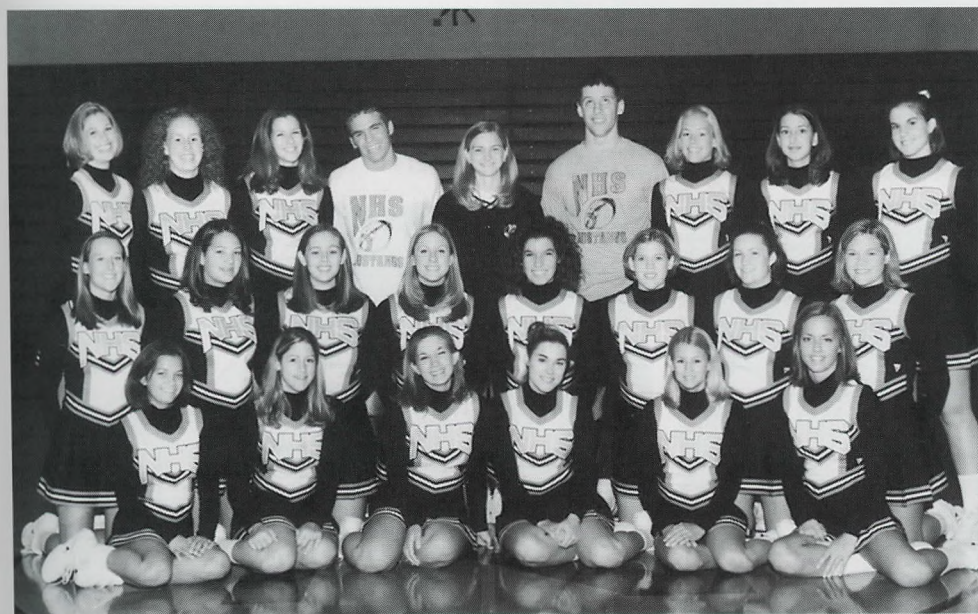

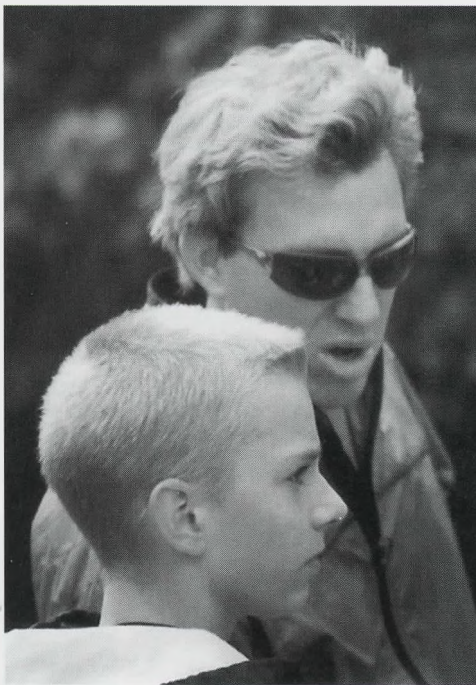

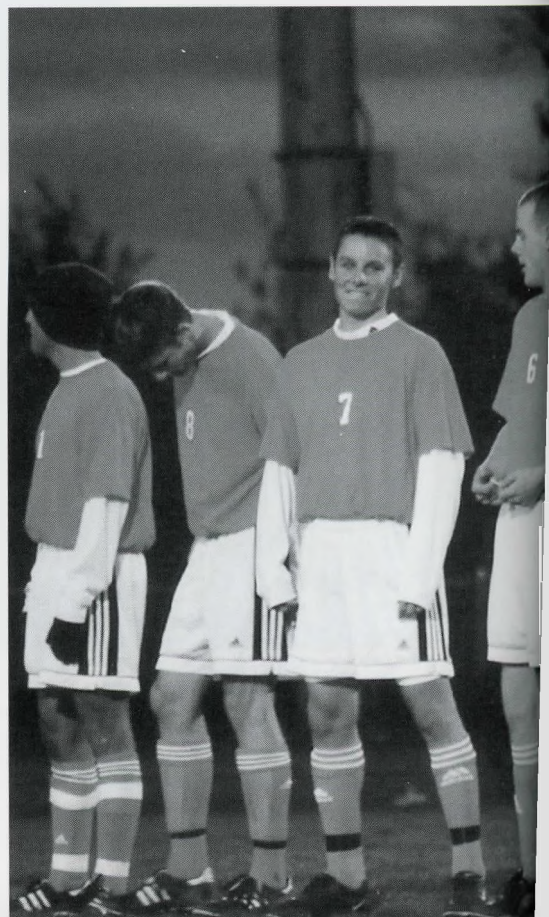

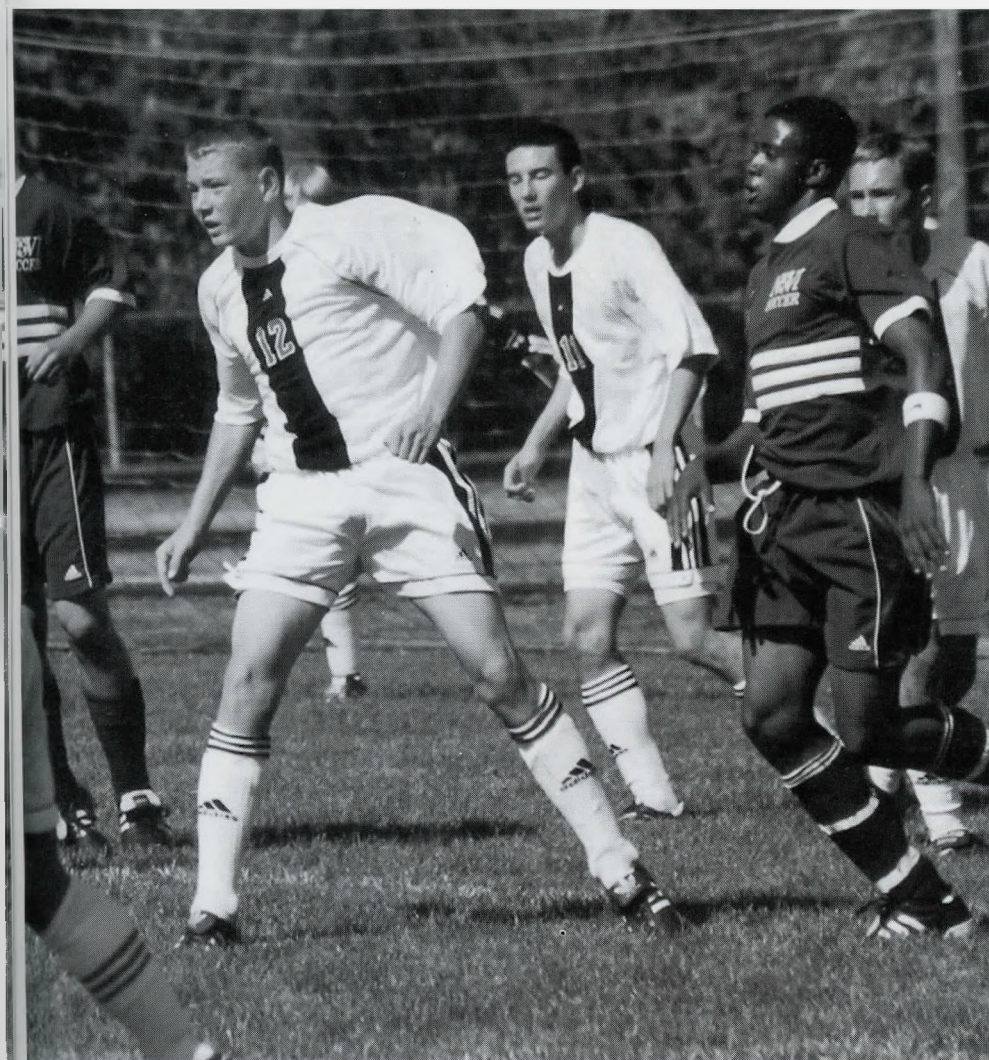

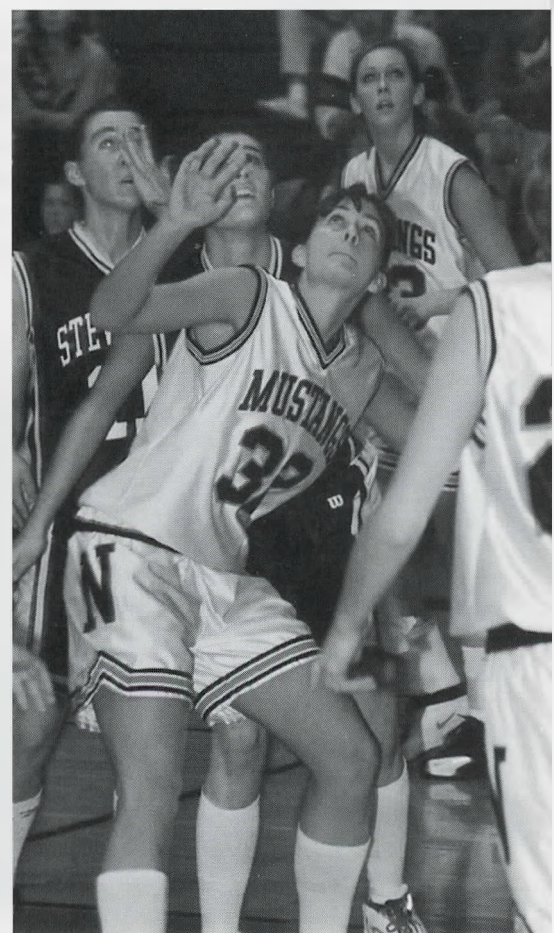

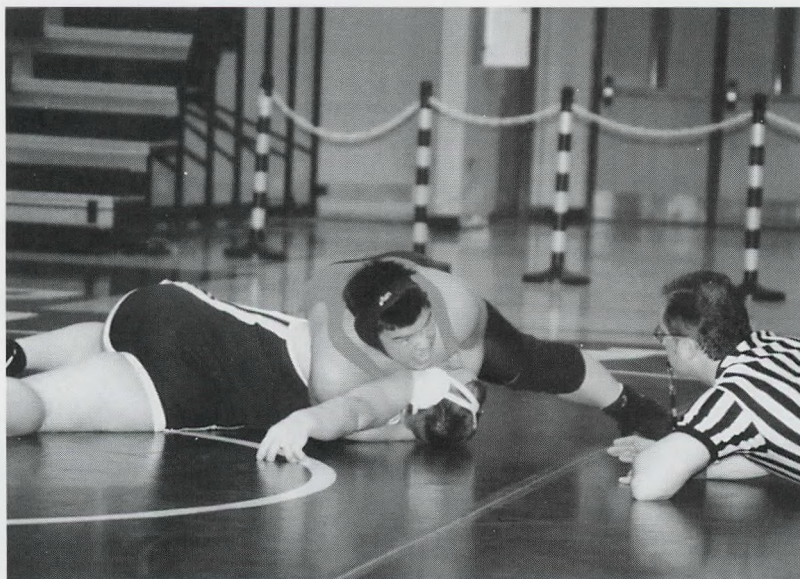
teams. Long hours of practice, running and drilling helped contribute to a very respectable varsity team.

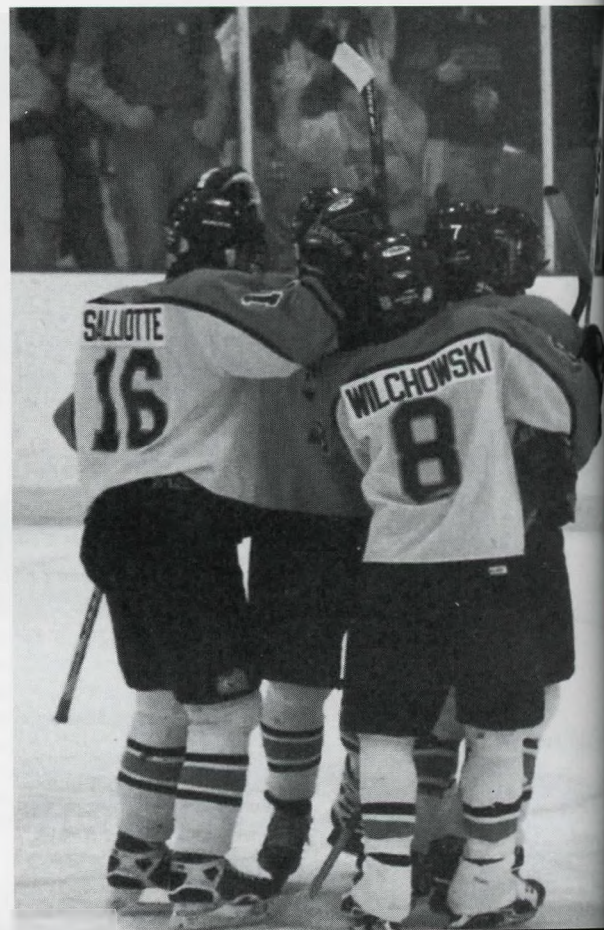

Bump, Set and Spike the World

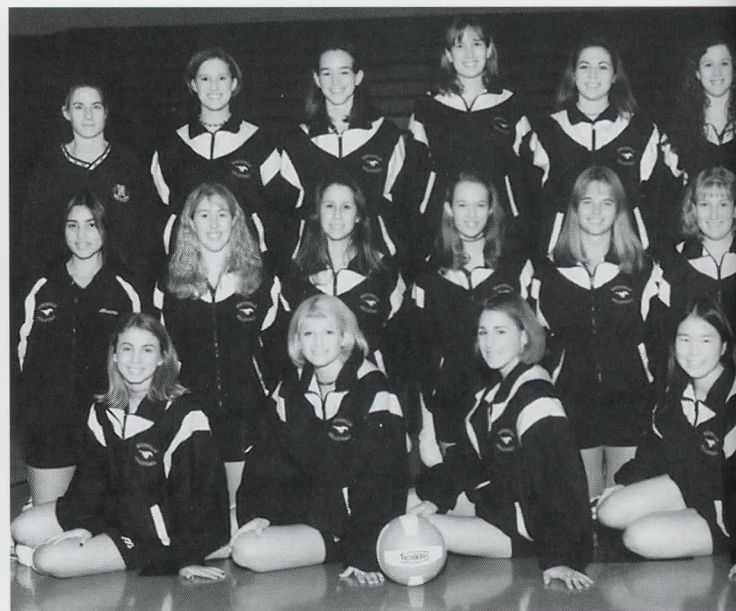

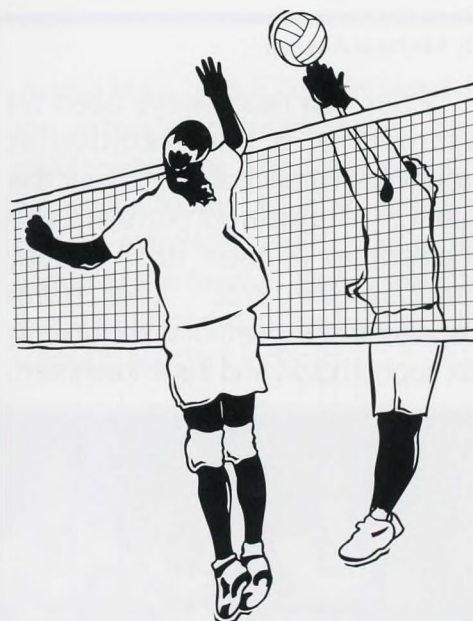

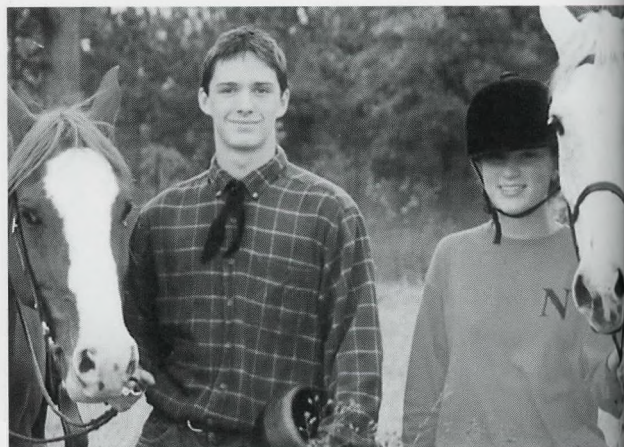

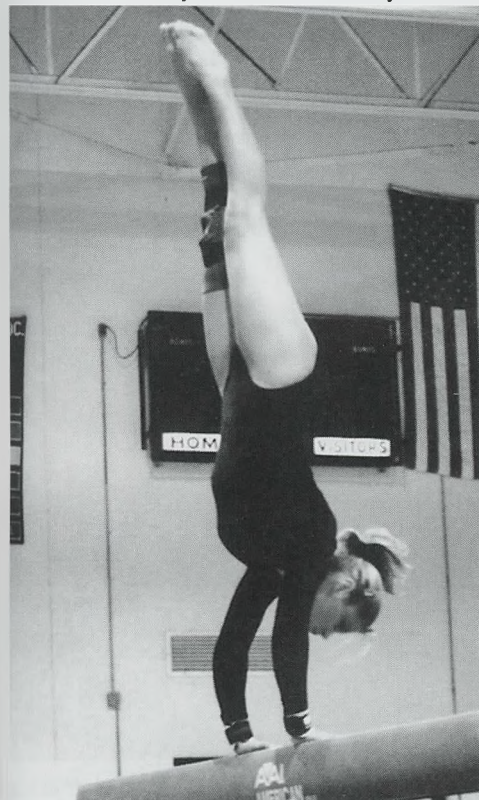

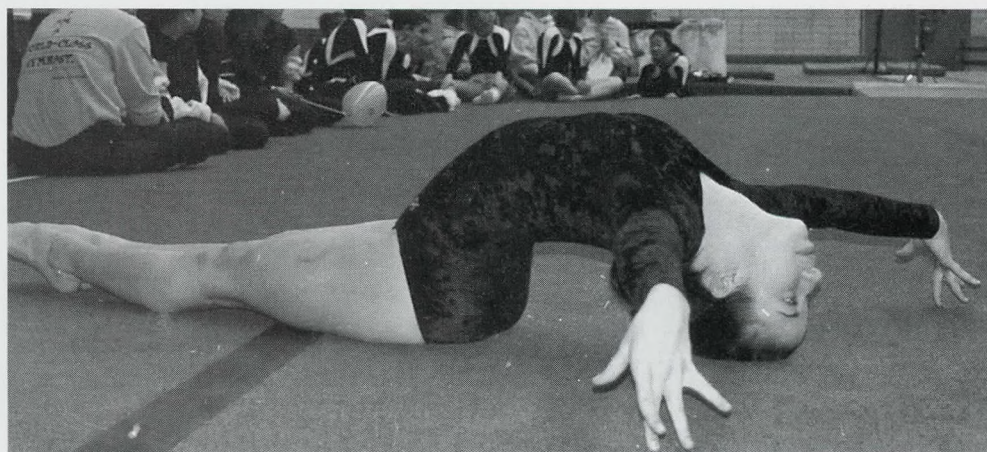

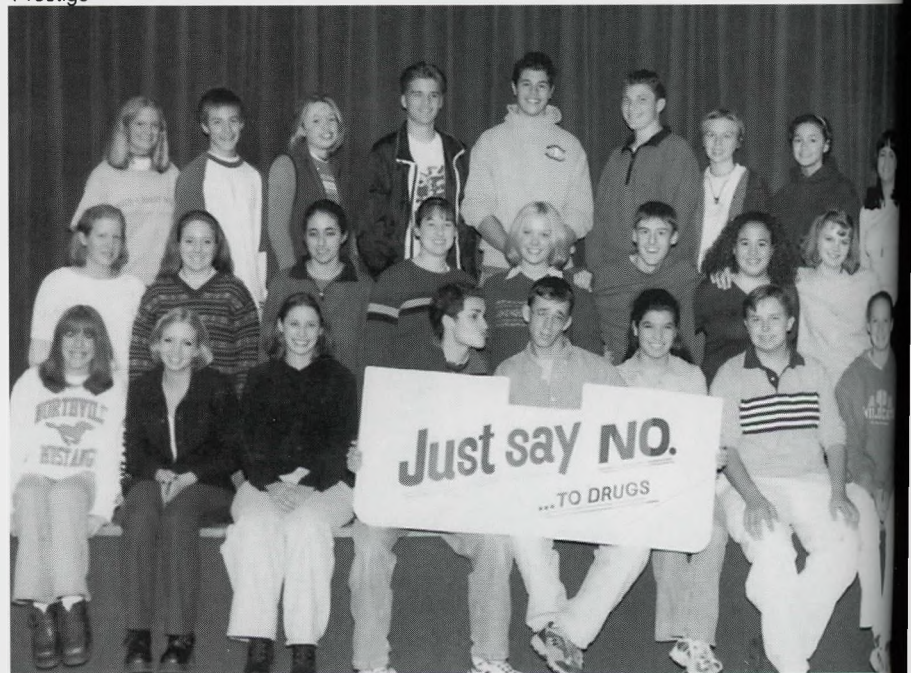

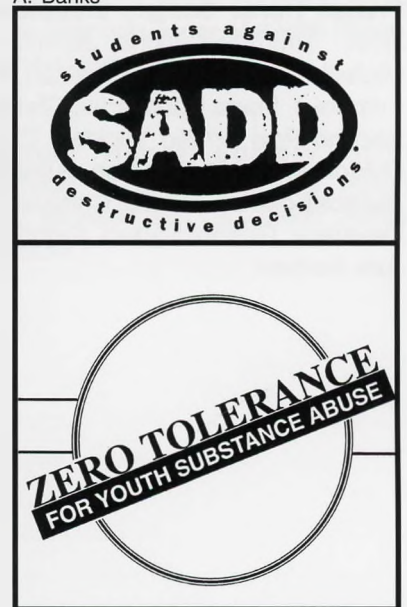

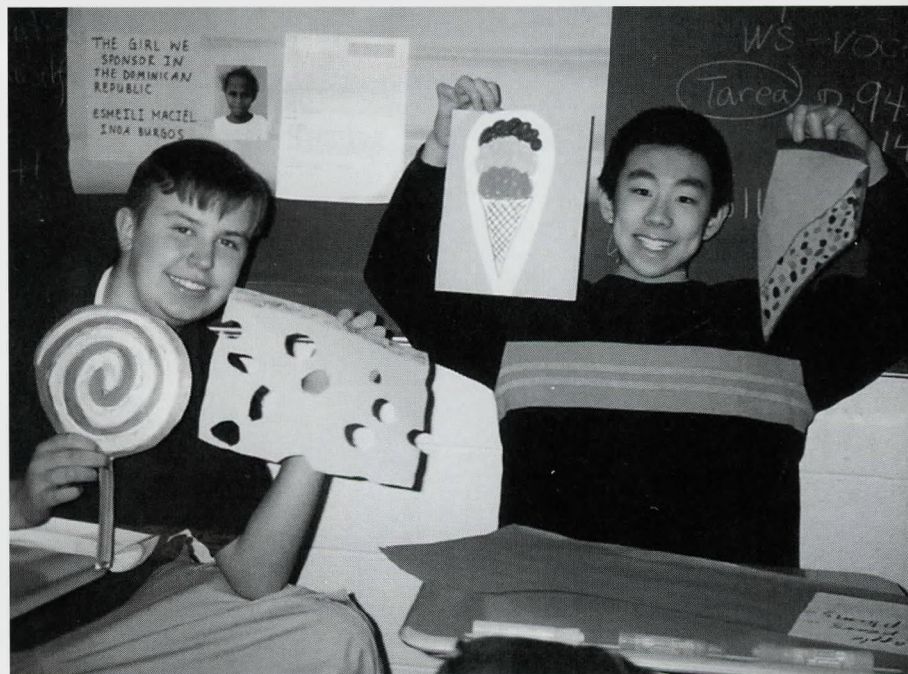

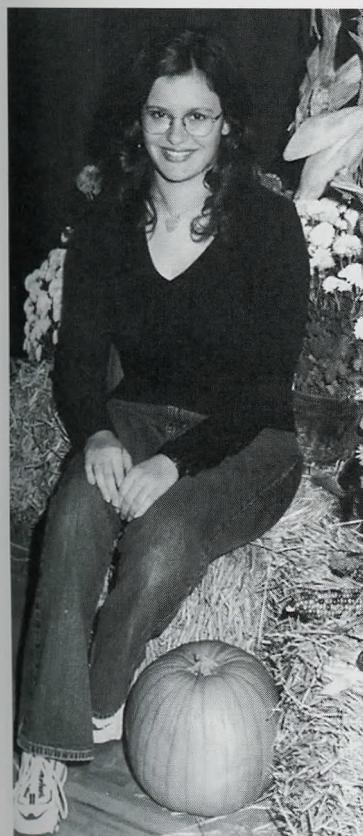
French Club

German Club

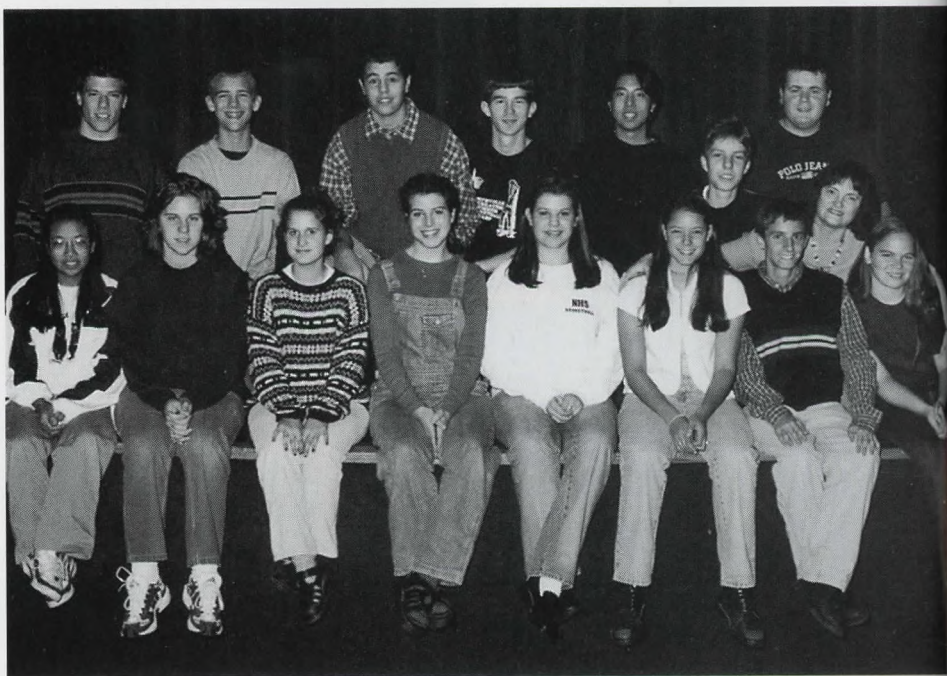

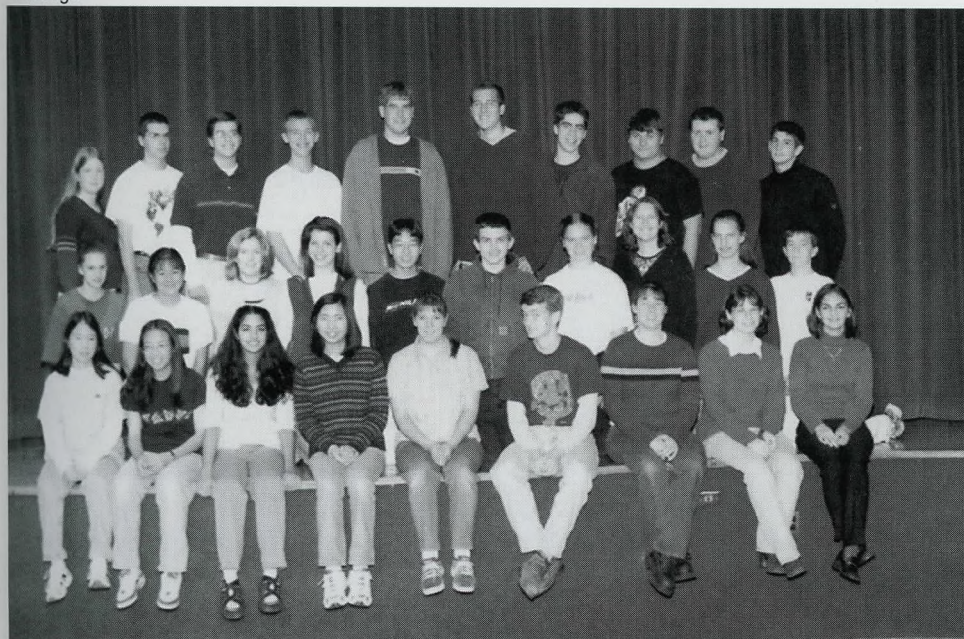

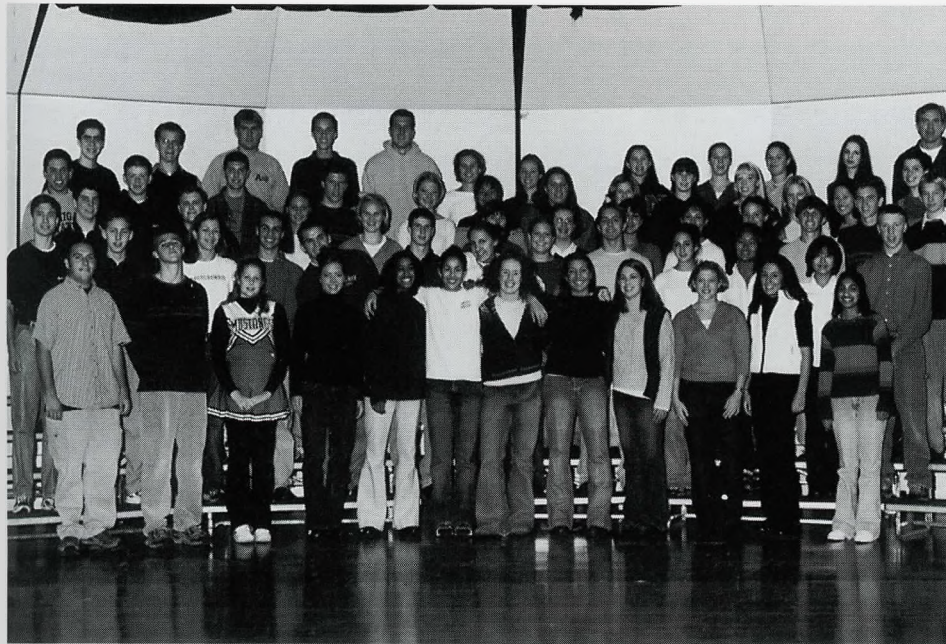

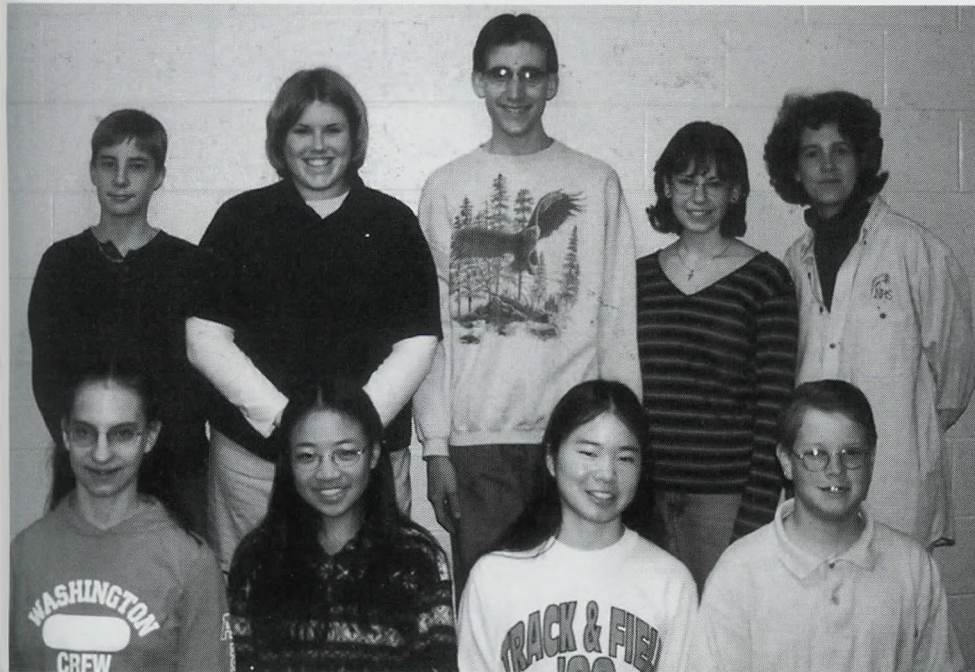


The World as Their Audience

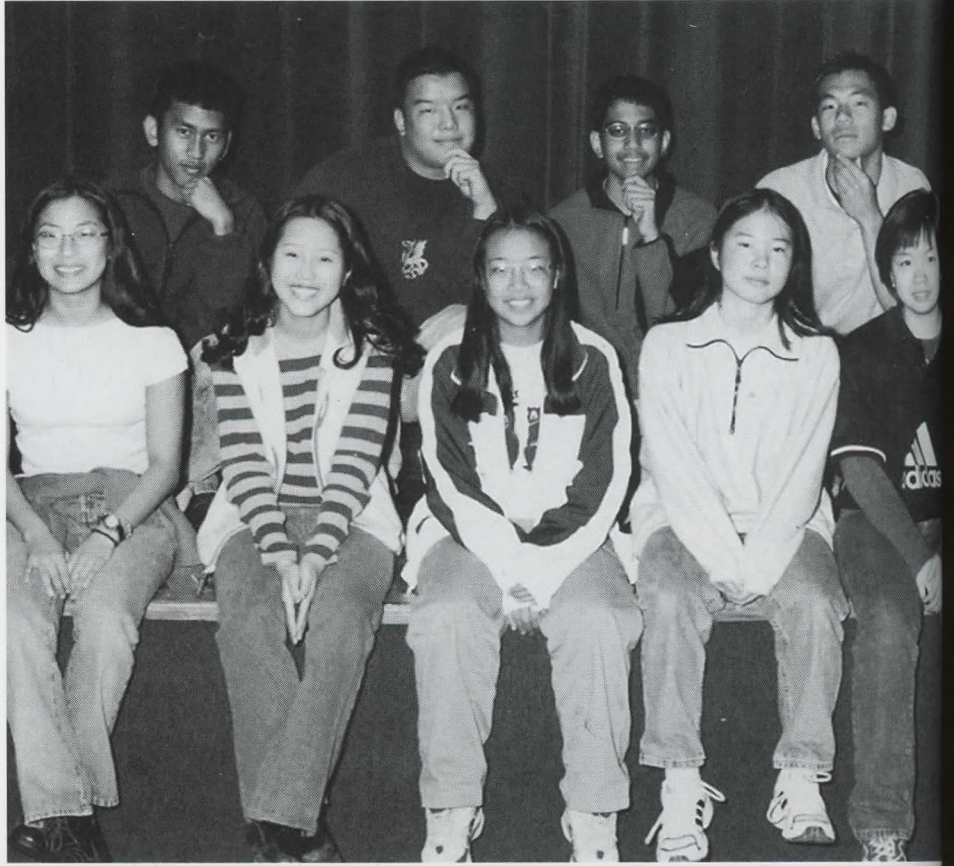

A World of Harmony

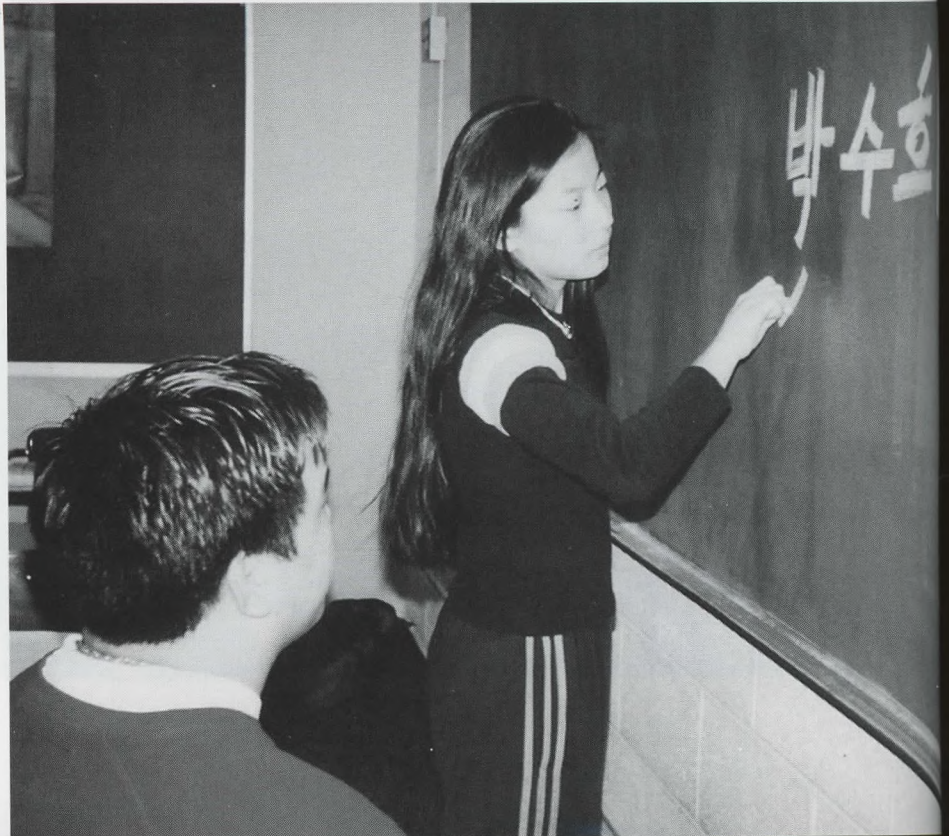

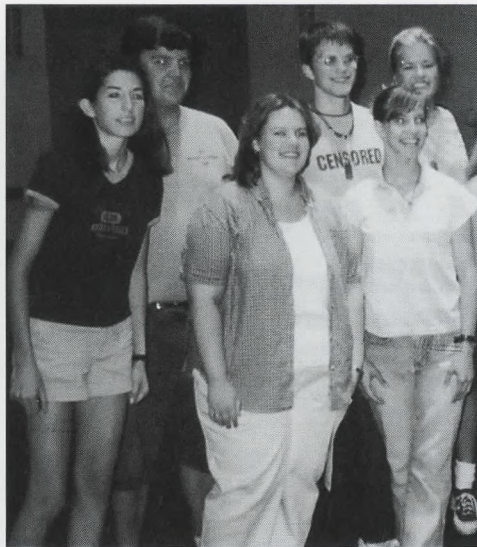

The 2000 Palladium was desktop published using two IBM Aptiva computers. The program used is Aldus Pagemaker 5.0. The 221 page book was printed by Herff Jones, Inc., 6015 Travis Lane, Shawnee Mission, Kansas 66201.

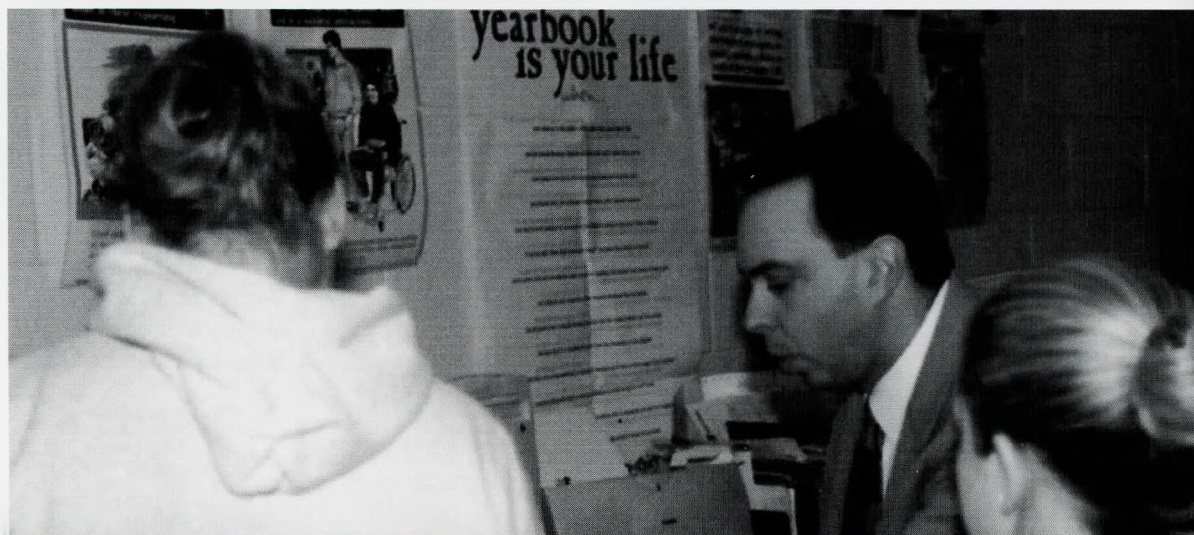
The 1350 copies of the spring delivered 2000 Palladium were printed on 80th Bordeaux Special Paper, except the endsheet which was printed on RE.01 Crystalline with Silver HJ970 print. The cover was printed on Vibratex 1075 black base material in 120pt. Davis Binder Board with whirlpool grain, an Illusion F-19 foil stamp, silver silkscreen #23 and an Earth Hologram Tip-on. The spot colors used were Silver HJ970, Forest HJ350, Gold HJ960, Pearlescent Blue HJ8483 and Crimson HJ222.

The 2000 Palladium used Arial as the primary typeface, printing the body copy in 12pt., the captions in 10pt., and the photo credits in 8pt.. Additional typefaces used in different sections included Tempus Sans ITC, Lucida Handwriting, Kino MT, Arial Italic, Comic Sans Italic and Times New Roman.

All underclass panels were from Jostens National School Studios. It was the first year pictures were taken digitally and directly sent to the Herff Jones Plant. Team pictures were from Visual Sports Network. All graphics and layouts were created by staff graphics experts. Candid photos were taken by both Prestige and students. There were forty-one pages of four-color process.

Subscription sales funded most of the publication cost. Circulation of the 2000 Palladium was 1350 books. The cost per book was \$38. Additional monies were the result of business advertising. Ads ranged from \$50 to \$200.
