The year 2000 Homecoming was unlike any before!




This year's floats appeared to







Northville High School students do atmosphere and activity, which not always have an exact game plan, but nonetheless, these teens know how to have a good time.








However, it seems that there are











Although you may see someone everyday in the halls, it just might take sitting next to them in one of your classes to discover your true feelings.






Kitakis, "Teachers are the problem." Other students have found that adjusting to the new school can be a significant problem.



The entire week led up to the "Sadie Hawkin's" dance on Saturday, Feb. 24, which proved a huge success.









On the field, the Mustangs had a great season, making the playoffs for the first time since 1993 and becoming District Champions while defeating rival Novi twice in the process.







### **Golfers Swing Into Time**












In addition, the varsity team




In the final moments of the game, senior Sarah Hesse spikes the winning point.








### Tumbling Through Time






How much dedication does it take to be a pomer? Well with a season that starts in July and doesn't finish until the end of February, you tell me.


### Time for Spanish Culture











along with others.



### Time Of Our Lives



The 2001 Palladium was desktop published using two IBM Aptiva computers. The program used is Aldus Pagemaker 5.0. The 244 page book was printed by Herff Jones Inc., 6015 Travis Lane, Shawnee Mission, Kansas 66202.

The 1500 copies of the spring delivered 2001 Palladium were printed on 80# Bordeaux Special, except the endsheet which was printed on Vibracolor White (VC01) and was printed in black ink, front side only. The cover was printed on Vista Custom Embossed on Vibra Tex Black base material in 120 point. Davis Binder Board with Caracul grain. The cover also had a silver silkscreen application (#23) on front lid and spine, an orange foil stamping application (F-5) on front lid, and three-coins tipped on by school. The binding is Smvth Sewn, rounded and backed.

The 2001 Palladium used Arial as the primary typeface, printing the body copy in 12 pt., the captions in 10 pt., and the photo credits in 8 pt. Additional typefaces used in different included sections Rockwell Extra Bold, Brush Script Italic, Century Gothic Bold, Colonna MT Bold Italic and Bookman Old Style Bold Italic.



All graphics and layouts were created by staff graphics experts. Candid photos were taken by both Prestige and students. There were 45 pages of fourcolor process.

Subscription sales funded most of the publication cost. Circulation of the 2001 Palladium was 1500 books. The cost per book was \$40. Additional monies were the result of business advertising. Ads ranged from \$50 to \$200.


