



On music day, students transformed into their music idols.


"Rap day was fun because I've been waiting four years to do it," said senior Michelle Pike.

Spirit Week was a time when students could finally break out of the norm and have a fantastic time.





Every student has a favorite part of Spirit Week they recall fondly, and for some, it is the pep assembly.


Some love the singing talent of Treblemakers and Backbeat, and some just like the little things, such as the thrill of watching a balloon floating across the gym.

Homecoming weekend was a great way to cap off an exciting Spirit Week.



Television has been in most people's lives since they were watching Sesame Street. Since then, though, people's tastes have grown and changed along with them.


To get a better understanding of students' tastes, a simple question was posed: What is your favorite TV show?






You will always remember your first. Your first crush, your first relationship, and of course, your first kiss. Do you remember who you shared your first kiss with?







After a long, hard week at school, students are ready to relax and hang out.


Taco Bell, Bora Bora, The Cider Mill and Custard Time are just a few places students spend their spare time.


"I go to Custard Time a lot because my friend worked there, and their custard is tasty," said senior Meghan Fidge.



When the final bell rings, students rush to their cars to prepare for their after-school jobs.










#### FOR HERE OR TO GO?




Each cast member put forth complete dedication. The cast met daily for three hours to run through the show in order for character work to be critiqued.


Senior Michael Howell played the lead role, Tye McCleary. "In order to improve my character, I was always in the moment when I practiced," Howell said.

"This year's cast worked really well together, and I have made a lot of friends," said senior Megan Dielenhein.











The boys only had two losses. "It was pretty good. We had a winning record, so it was good," Dulzo said.


"It's hard." Masato Morioka said about the freshmen team's practices. But, he added, "I think I did pretty good."





senior Kathy Garfield.


Practicing for a month paid off, and the girls received third place at their competition.

Varsity player senior Dave Van Horn likes "watching Flo [Ryan Hillock] get hit in the head with the ball at practice."


The teams' practices pay off on game nights. Before most games, the freshman team likes to joke around with each other to help them relax, but when it's time to play, they get serious.











The winner of the match is awarded with the pin, which they keep the whole year.


The bowling squad consists of four teams. The boys and girls varsity and junior varsity teams practice intensely three times a week at Novi Bowl.







Considering his band experiences so far, sophomore William Fankell said, "Band is band-tastic!"


But maybe senior Christopher Uberti summed it up best: "I'm in band? I thought it was yoga. Go Jazz!"













Ms. Pearson added, "The club also improves self-confidence and theater appreciation."


In addition to broadening their theatrical

The Environmental and Recycling clubs have started to join forces. They now do a lot of the projects together.


The Recycling clubs meet every Thursday after school outside the forum. They collect the papers in the blue recycling bins.



Working together with the school and their community, Make A Difference helps affect many lives outside of the classroom.


President Drew Kesler, a senior and third year member, said, "I got involved by hearing about the fun camp the organization does every year."

"Helping out my community makes me appreciate what I have in life," said senior Robin Abbey-Lee.









Last year, the class was started by Mrs. Omiatek and Mrs. Stamoulis because web development and design did not have enough time to work on the web site.


The web site design class is not just a class; it also keeps teachers, students and the community updated with what is going on at school.


"I like the class because I have fun, and Stamoulis is the best," said senior Jeff Kemp.


Before making any changes to the old home page, the class was split up into groups to come up with different themes and ideas for the site. The web site contains 50 pages, which are constantly updated.

"You need a lot of patience and to be dedicated to be in this class," said Stamoulis.









(Top) Ms. Stamoulis instructs students on how to change the web page. (Above and above left) Students in the web design class are constantly updating the pages.

Before Cislo coached Quiz Bowl here, he coached where he taught in Chicago.





"My favorite memory is going to Hillside and seeing all of my old teachers," said sophomore Kelly Gleeson.





The class of 2008 has encountered a lot this past year, and they have a lot more to come.







- Publication of the book is made possible through the sale of books, retail and parent pride sales.
- The purchase price is \$50
- All 1,700 copies of the 296-page, all-color, 8-1/2" x 11" books were printed on 100# Bordeaux. An eight-page double gatefold tip-in was added in the senior section.
- The four-color litho CCN-I white cover was designed using Photoshop and Quark XPress. The design appears on a 120-point weight cover board with a varnish coating. The dust jacket was a new addition this year.
- The whole affair was stitched together using Smyth Sewn binding and printed by Herff Jones in Mission, Kansas.













"This has been a very memorable final musical for me," said senior Megan Dielenhein, who played Bobby's mother.






Can a team with younger players and less experience play better? Ask the boys tennis team.


Austin Jenkins said he liked "sharing the bus with the varsity soccer girls." Sophomore Mike Baskins said, "The team dinners are a lot of fun."

"I like kicking the crap out of kids," he said.


