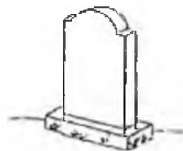

Remarks / Comments: An earlier transcription of this cemetery includes a Willie R. Clarkson, who died on 15 Aug 1872. Since this stone is located right next to another Clarkson stone (Marker 166), this could be Willie's stone.
